Dear Judge Watson and Secretary Rosemary Chiavetta:


After sending in my first letter (dated February 13, 2019) to withdraw my complaint, your office stated that they received my letter and that my case has been withdrawn as I requested and that no further correspondence, filings or document production is needed of me -- that my case has been withdrawn. Moreover, your office stated that since I withdrew my complaint, and since my case is considered withdrawn, the prehearing telephone conference scheduled for April 26, 2019 would be cancelled confirming the withdrawal. They also mentioned that I would receive the notice in the mail as confirmation (See attached copy). However, for some unknown reason FirstEnergy sent me document discovery request/filings long after I was told my case was withdrawn. At that point, I did not know what was going on. I was told my case/complaint was withdrawn/closed – how could this be? I sent another two letters to your office regarding my case with no response as to the status of my case.

I wish my case to be ruled withdrawn because I cannot find an attorney to represent me and to help me with the process. As a result my case should be considered withdrawn and not dismissed. I would like to reserve my right, should and if ever in the future I decide to take up this issue (at which time I will definitely need an attorney, and that is if I can find one, which has been very, very difficult).

I cannot find an attorney to represent me and I do not feel comfortable nor would it be in my best interest to represent myself at any prehearing telephone conference without a lawyer. Therefore, I will not be able to attend any telephone pre-hearing conference. I believe that a ruling on my request to withdraw would be suitable or proper considering the circumstances. I just want to withdraw my complaint/case.


