Dear Administrative Law Judge Cheskis:

Pursuant to 52 Pa. Code Section 5.94(b), the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement withdraws its Protest to the March 18, 2019 *Application of PPL Electric Utilities Corporation For Approval of Sale of Facilities to The City of Lancaster* ("Application") seeking Commission approval to transfer all PPL Electric Utilities Corporation ("PPL Electric") street lighting facilities within the Borough of the City of Lancaster to the City of Lancaster.

I&E filed its Protest on April 12, 2019 because it had concerns about the potential ratemaking impact of the Application. I&E discussed the issues raised in its Protest with PPL Electric counsel and now has a better understanding of the request. Additionally, I&E understands that PPL Electric is not seeking any ruling as part of the approval of this Application concerning the ratemaking treatment of the proposed transaction; therefore, any ratemaking concerns related to this transaction can be addressed in a subsequent base rate proceeding.

I&E is satisfied that the issues raised in its April 12th Protest have been adequately addressed and is willing to withdraw its Protest without prejudice to raising potential issues related to this transaction in PPL Electric's next base rate proceeding. Accordingly, I&E respectfully requests that Your Honor withdraw I&E's April 12th Protest.


