Duquesne Light invoiced Koppers Company, Inc., a predecessor to NOVA Chemicals, \$27,650 for the initial construction of the Kobuta Tap in 1942-43. Duquesne Light further invoiced Koppers Company \$5,250 to cover costs of relocating a portion of the Kobuta Tap at Koppers' request in 1953. Please see attached 1942 and 1953 cost letters from Duquesne Light to Koppers Company, Inc.

In answer to your telephone request, we have made a brief itemization of the \$27,650 connection charge the payment of which to the Duquesne Light Company is a part of our contract for electric service to your new Butadiene Plant. A brief breakdown of this charge is as follows:

As a further aid to a complete understanding of the scope of this work we are forwarding you one print of our drawing No. 2351-E1 which shows the substation electrical layout.

We are also forwarding one print of our drawing No. F-3210 on which we have indicated in red the transmission line right-of-way, beginning with the point where it connects to our existing 66,000 volt transmission line and concluding at the substation on your property. We have not yet completed the structural details of this line so we cannot submit a more detailed drawing at this time.

We trust that this is sufficient information to permit you to forward us your purchase order for the above itemized connection charge so that there can be no possibility of any delay in the completion of this service connection.

Gentlemen:

Confirming our recent telephone conversation and based on relocation of the incoming 66 Kv. transmission line and switching equipment together with the necessary structures to the opposite side of your transformer bank in the sub station at your Kobuta plant, our "out-of-pocket" expense would be \$5,250.00. This includes relocating our incoming 66 Kv. transmission line and our metering and tying-in to your new structures.

We estimate that your part of the work, including foundations, structures, and fence, and relocating the switching equipment in the sub station, would be approximately \$20,500.00. If you decide to make this change in order to make room for the expansion of the warehouse at your plastics plant in Kobuta, will you please forward us your order authorizing us to bill you in the amount of \$5,250.00. We will furnish the design of this sub station rearrangement if you decide on this scheme and will so inform us. If there is further information which we may furnish on this subject, we shall be very pleased to hear from you.


