Dear Secretary Chiavetta:

This letter serves to memorialize communications between Metropolitan Edison Company (“Company”) and the Complainant in the above-referenced matter that have taken place via electronic mail. The Company is in receipt of a letter from Mr. Chenosky, dated March 24, 2019 and postmarked on May 30, 2019, which seeks both an “unspecified time frame extension” while in the alternative objecting to the Company’s Set I interrogatories and requests for production served on May 16, 2019 (“Discovery Requests”).

The Company has advised Mr. Chenosky that the due dates stated within its service of these Discovery Requests are prescribed by regulation and were not arbitrarily set by the Company. That notwithstanding, recognizing Mr. Chenosky is a pro se complainant and, in an effort to accommodate his concerns, the Company has voluntarily agreed to an extension under which detailed objections would be provided by Friday, June 21, 2019, and responses to all other requests would be due by Friday, July 5, 2019. The Company has no intent to move to compel for lack of response or on the wholesale objections Mr. Chenosky raises in the alternative until those extended deadlines have passed in order to afford him the additional time he seeks to prepare his detailed objections and responses as required by the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission’s regulations. However, this extension is not intended as a waiver of the Company’s rights to move to compel responses to the Discovery Requests, and the Company reserves the right to do so under the Commission’s regulations should proper objections and/or responses not be served in accordance with the extended deadlines.
