In accordance with the Interim Order issued on December 27, 2018 in the above-referenced matter, this letter serves as a status report on behalf of Metropolitan Edison Company ("Met-Ed"). Met-Ed initiated discovery on January 15, 2019. Mr. Siegle did contact me to discuss the discovery and litigation deadlines in this matter on January 30, 2019, at which time Met-Ed voluntarily extended the deadlines for objections to February 24, 2019 and the deadline for responses to March 6, 2019. On February 22, 2019, the Complainant sought a continuance of the proceedings, to include but not limited to his ability to respond to discovery. On February 26, 2019, an Interim Order was issued in this proceeding, granting the extension request in part, and extended discovery in this matter until May 31, 2019, among other dates. On April 24, 2019, Met-Ed filed a Motion to Compel due to the fact that no objections or responses had been received. On April 29, 2019, Administrative Law Judge Jeffrey A. Watson granted the Motion to Compel and directed Mr. Siegle to submit full and complete responses no later than May 30, 2019. On May 22, 2019, an interim order was entered which revised the April 29, 2019 Interim Order and set a response date of June 6, 2019. To date, the only response from Mr. Siegle has been a response, dated June 2, 2019, to the April 29, 2019 Interim Order granting Met-Ed's Motion to Compel, and raising objections for the first time in this proceeding. Further, Mr. Siegle has failed to provide notification of his expert and factual witnesses in accordance with the December 27, 2018 Interim Order. Met-Ed timely provided notice of its expert and factual witnesses. Due to Mr. Siegle's lack of response to discovery and other procedural deadlines, Met-Ed intends to file a motion to dismiss Mr. Siegle's case by the end of June 2019.

At this point, Met-Ed believes that a ruling on its upcoming Motion to Dismiss is appropriate. In the alternative, Met-Ed suggests that it may be valuable for a prehearing conference to be set for this matter in order to determine Mr. Siegle's intent in moving his complaint forward.

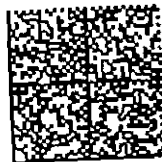
