In Lieu of the denial for continuance requested within 5 days of hearing, this P.E.C.O. customer does enclose a verified statement regarding this case since I am not medically able to attend said Hearing on October 30, 2018.

On or about September 2018, I Keary Willis, requested a continuance on this matter for after October given a medical problem. The continuance was granted, however, it was scheduled for Tuesday, October 30, 2018. Pursuant to the first request of after October, a fax was sent to the Administrative Judge for continuance in congruence to the first request of after October 2018. The fax contained a medical determination of the inability of Keary Willis to be present on October 30, 2018. Subsequently, a call was made to determine the outcome of the continuance, it was denied.

On October 29, 2018, Dana McCullum called to request 3,500.00 and indicate that the Commission was unable to offer a payment arrangement as previously requested by the undersigned. To that end, the undersigned has made it clear to P.E.C.O., previously, and with Ms. McCullum, the C.A.P. program was never accepted with the terms of the C.A.P. plan. Ms. McCullum asked if someone other than the undersigned filled out the C.A.P. application. While the undersigned did in fact fill out the application, the undersigned on more than one occasion asked that it C.A.P. not be used as C.A.P. limited the options to the undersigned that are present under the budget plan.

At issue are also the amounts not paid by the undersigned. Once again this P.E.C.O. customer has been plagued with medical issues since applying for C.A.P. and has been medically unable to sustain an income to commensurate with financial utility service as well as other financial obligations. At this time Keary Willis has shown to P.E.C.O. to be too impoverished for the payment plans that were set up previously, notwithstanding the rejection by Keary Willis of the C.A.P. program. In addition at issue is the issue of medical certification availability that has not been exhausted by my family.

Keary Willis is actively applying and been approved for financial disability payments beginning December 2018. Those payments will sustain any ongoing utility obligations as long as a viable payment plan can be reached by the Commission as C.A.P. was rejected by the P.E.C.O. customer and never used.

These are the issues known by the undersigned as discovery was never sent by P.E.C.O to the complainant.
