
Dear Secretary Chiavetta:

The purpose of this letter is to notify the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (“PUC” or “Commission”), **in the abundance of caution**, that the above-referenced Easement Agreement (dated June 27, 2019) (“Agreement”) between Duquesne Light Company (“DLC”) and the Pittsburgh Water and Sewer Authority (“PWSA” or “Authority”) was filed with the Commission by **DLC on August 13, 2019, at Docket No. U- 2019-3012176.**

Until such time as the Commission provides different direction, PWSA does not intend to separately file the Agreement with the Commission under 66 Pa.C.S. § 507,¹ since the Agreement has already been filed by DLC² and a separate filing could lead to confusion or inconsistent determinations.

¹ To the extent deemed necessary, the Agreement filed at U- 2019-3012176 is incorporated herein by reference. 52 Pa.Code § 1.33. That being said, it is PWSA's position that the Agreement's 30-day review period under 66 Pa.C.S. § 507 runs from the date of DLC's filing (as opposed to the date of this letter/notice).

² Under the circumstances, DLC is the “utility” entering into an agreement with PWSA, a “municipal corporation.” PWSA is not technically entering into an agreement with “utility,” DLC — which is not a “municipal corporation.” See 66 Pa.C.S. § 102 (definitions).
