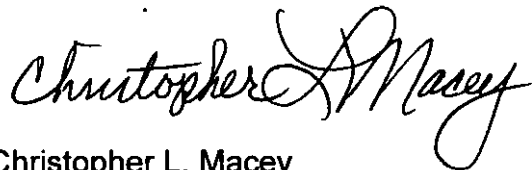

PETITION FOR EMERGENCY RELIEF

TO THE PENNSYLVANIA PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION:

AND NOW, Pursuant to PA Code 52, Section 3.2, I, Christopher L. Macey, (Complainant), *pro se*, hereby file this Petition for Emergency Relief due to poor service and breach of settlement agreement.

I. Introduction

1. On January 10, 2019, the Complainant executed a settlement agreement with West Penn Power Company (the Respondent) whereby the Respondent agreed to install the smart meter on a utility pole relocated away from the Complainant's residence. The Complainant was to install a separate utility pole at the location specified by the Respondent's "designer."
2. West Penn Power filed a CERTIFICATE OF SATISFACTION with the PA PUC on January 16.
3. Complainant contracted with Valley Electric on April 26, 2019 to install the utility pole and assemble a feeder wire from the pole to Complainant's residence and tie-in to Complainant's electrical panel. The cost to the Complainant is \$4,479.
4. West Penn Power's designer did not visit Complainant's residence until mid-April to locate the position for the utility pole.
5. Excessive rainfall in May, June and July caused Valley Electric to delay installation of the utility pole.
6. Complainant has notified the Respondent of delays in the contractor's work, the most recent was an e-mail message dated July 12, 2019 addressed to Scott Curcio (copy to West Penn Power's attorney Lauren Lepkoski) advising that Valley Electric was still experiencing weather delays in the installation. Complainant received NO RESPONSE from this message or any other correspondence from the Respondent, West Penn Power, regarding the delays in the installation.
7. On Friday August 16, 2019 at 10:22 AM, Complainant received an e-mail message from the Respondent (Lauren M. Lepkoski, Esq.) stating that "the Company will be installing the smart meter at your residence."

8. At approximately 1:30 PM on the same day, August 16, 2019, West Penn Power, or their agent, installed a smart meter on Complainant's house. The meter installer did not announce himself to anyone inside the residence or advise anyone what he was doing.
9. West Penn Power (Respondent) has been unresponsive to this event and many other previous requests that Complainant has sent to them.

II. Background

1. Complaint C-2017-2628021 was filed because the Complainant's spouse, Elizabeth Vienna, has emf-sensitivity, where she suffers pain and discomfort from electronic devices that emit radio frequency or microwave frequency signals.
2. Due to the smart meter being installed on Complainant's house, Elizabeth Vienna has suffered several symptoms including headache, cranial pain, nausea and general anxiety.
3. The smart meter is on the same side of the house, and in-close proximity to the bedroom. As a result, Complainant's wife has not been able to sleep in the bedroom, forcing her to sleep in Complainant's car.
4. The smart meter has forced Complainant's wife to limit the amount of time she spends inside the house.

III. Requested Emergency Relief

1. That West Penn Power remove the digital smart meter from Complainant's house **immediately** and replace it with the analog meter that was removed on August 16.
2. That West Penn Power relocate the smart meter to the new utility pole away from the house when the feeder line and related preparation work is completed **and inspected**. It should be noted that West Penn Power has already assigned work order number 344 061 857 to the project.
3. All other relief that the court deems proper and deserved by the Complainant.

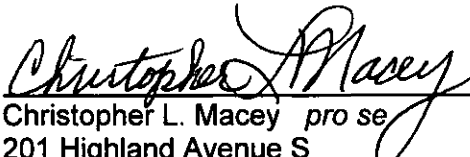
IV. Conclusion

1. If Complainant does not receive immediate emergency relief, the following irreparable conditions and effects will occur:
 - a. Discomfort, pain and suffering by Elizabeth Vienna.
 - b. Loss of and interruption of sleep by Elizabeth Vienna.
 - c. Stress affecting the health and well-being of Elizabeth Vienna and the Complainant, including irreparable damage to Elizabeth Vienna's nervous system and the mental health and well being of Complainant and Elizabeth Vienna.
 - d. Complainant may need to house his wife, Elizabeth, in a hotel or other location at his expense.
2. Complainant has requested that West Penn Power shut off the power service at Complainant's residence to make the residence inhabitable. Should the electric power service be interrupted, Complainant will incur irreparable damages due to spoiled food, loss of internet and other communication services, other costs related to loss of electrical service, and potentially have

emergency situations without an ability for the Complainant and/or residents in Complainant's home to be able to respond for emergency services.

Wherefore, for the above reasons, Christopher L. Macey requests that the Commission grant his PETITION FOR EMERGENCY RELIEF.

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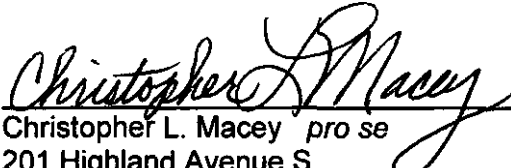
