If a mutually agreeable resolution cannot be reached the Customer Care manager or supervisor will review the complaint and then notify the customer of the outcome. At that time, the customer will also be notified of its right to file a complaint with the PAPUC and Usource will provide the telephone number, facsimile number and website of the PAPUC for the customer's convenience.

Usource will exercise rigorous quality control over the services rendered and will ensure that its customer service representatives are well trained in applicable law and PAPUC rules governing the provision of retail gas service.

Usource provides training to all personnel and stresses the importance and understanding of each of the following objectives:

- Knowledge and awareness of applicable Pennsylvania laws and regulations governing marketing and consumer protection.
- Knowledge and understanding of responsible and ethical sales practices.
- · Knowledge of the Company's products and services.
- Knowledge of relevant terms and definitions.
