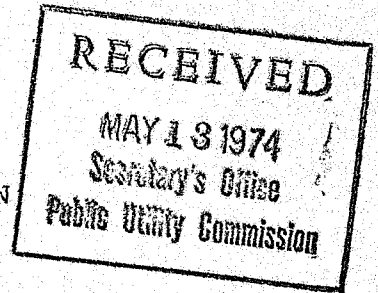

TO THE PENNSYLVANIA PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION:

1. Applicant's name and address are Interstate Energy Company, P. O. Box 1916, Houston, Texas, 77001.
2. Applicant's attorneys are Peter Platten, Esquire, and Ballard, Spahr, Andrews & Ingersoll, 1035 Land Title Building, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, 19110.
3. Applicant is a petroleum products pipeline common carrier, incorporated in Delaware, authorized to do business in Pennsylvania and holds a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity issued February 6, 1973, by this Honorable Commission at Docket A. 97032.
4. Condition 1 b of said Order reads as follows:  
"That in construction and operation of the proposed pipeline, all pertinent provisions of the proposed transmission pipeline regulations, issued as an Order Nisi by this Commission on May 17, 1971, shall apply, except as may be later modified by this Commission."

Rule 3 of Part II and Section B 6 of Part II of this Honorable Commission's Proposed Transmission Pipeline Regulations promulgated by this said Order Nisi of May 17, 1971, requires Applicant to secure approval of pipeline-railroad crossings in accordance with the Public Utility Law.

Section 409 of the Public Utility Law prevents a public utility engaged in the transportation of passengers or property, "without a prior order of the commission," from constructing its facilities across the facilities of any other public utility engaged in transportation of passengers or property.

5. Applicant herewith applies for an Order of this Honorable Commission evidencing its approval of the point and method of construction of Applicant's pipeline under the railroad facilities of the Reading Company at four locations.

These locations are generally described as:

(a) Crossing No. 1--Mile Post 14.53, East White-land Township, Chester County;

(b) Crossing No. 2--Mile Post 39.24, Three Hundred Fifty Seven feet north of Morgan Creek, Richland Township, Bucks County;

(c) Crossing No. 3--Mile Post 30.01, Upper Providence Township, Montgomery County; and

(d) Crossing No. 4--One Thousand Forty-Seven feet north of railroad bridge 7/86, Perkiomen Township, Montgomery

County.

A copy of the plan of crossing for each of the crossings is attached hereto, made part hereof as Applicant's exhibits 1, 2, 3 and 4, respectively.

6. Each proposed crossing meets the design and construction criteria of the Federal Department of Transportation set forth in 49CFR 195.256; Section 434.14.5 of American National Standards Institute Code, Liquid Petroleum Transportation Piping System B 31.4, current edition; the American Petroleum Institute's Recommended Practice for Liquid Petroleum Pipelines Crossing Railroads and Highways, No. 1102, fourth edition, September, 1968, and that of Paragraph B 6 of Part III of the said Proposed Pipeline Regulations.


7. A plan for each crossing has been submitted by Applicant to the Reading Company for more than fifteen months with the following results: no approvals received; Reading Company requested increased wall thickness to .500 inch.

8. Approval by this Honorable Commission is necessary and proper for the convenience, welfare and safety of the public so that Applicant's pipeline facility may be promptly and properly constructed across the railroad facilities of the Reading Company.

WHEREFORE, Interstate Energy Company prays this Honorable Commission to issue its Order approving the point and method by which each of the crossings described above is to be constructed.

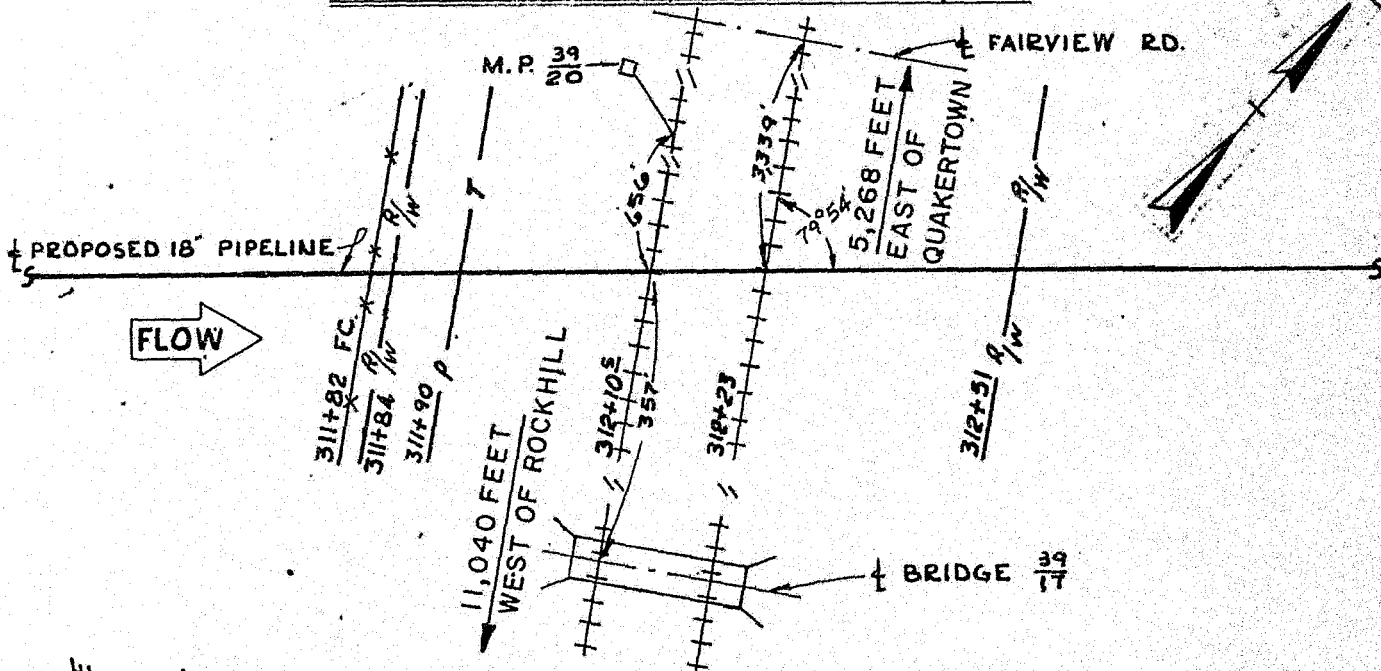

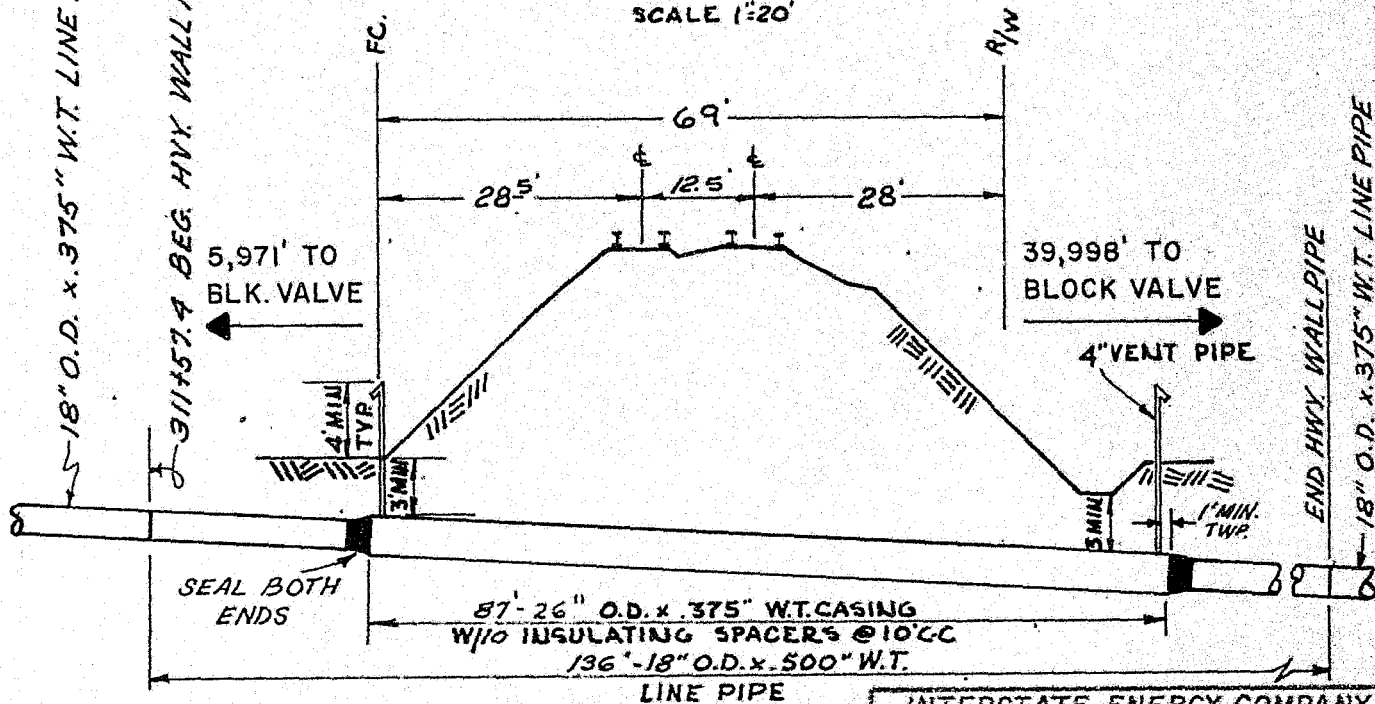

3. Respondent, Reading Company, Debtor, is a railroad in reorganization under Section 77 of the Bankruptcy Act, and is a common carrier by railroad, subject to the Public Utility Commission Law.
4. Respondent's motion to dismiss is based on the fact that paragraph 1. A. of the Commission's Order dated February 6, 1973 states: "That before any operations are commenced upon the construction of the pipeline, Interstate Energy Company shall obtain and show evidence to this Commission that it has obtained required approvals from the

Delaware River Basin Commission and other agencies having appropriate jurisdiction for all construction and operation to be performed within their respective jurisdiction.

5. Respondent's hesitancy in approving the proposed crossings is based on our interpretation that the Applicant does not have the authority at this point in time to construct the pipeline. To approve the proposed crossings at this time, is, in our opinion, premature.

6. Nothing in this Motion shall be construed as acknowledging that the Commission has jurisdiction over the involved matter. Furthermore, Respondent specifically reserves the right to raise the issue of the Commission's jurisdiction at a later time.

WHEREFORE, Reading Company, Debtor, prays that this Honorable Commission issue an order dismissing the Application.

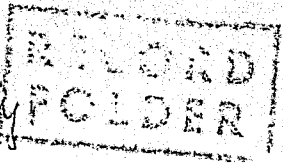
Receipt is acknowledged of your letter dated June 4, 1974, advising that a hearing on the above matter has been set for June 11, 1974, in the Commission's Hearing Room, Harrisburg, Pa.

It is the position of Reading Company, Debtor, that this hearing is not held pursuant to the Rules of Practice issued by the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission. Rule 17 states that applications involving transportation of property, will be served by the Commission at least twenty days before the hearing date. Since the application for the crossings involve the transportation of property, the twenty day notice provision must be met. Rules 30(B) and 31 require the publication of a concise statement of the proceeding, one a week for two consecutive weeks immediately prior to the date of hearing in at least one newspaper of general circulation, in the county in which the crossing is located.



Since the circumstances in this particular case in no way justify the elimination of the Rules of Practice, Reading Company will not attend the hearing scheduled for June 11, 1974, and respectfully requests that the applicant comply with all Rules of Practice.

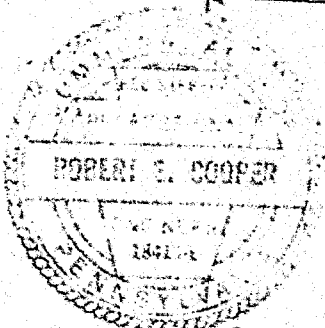

The above described permanent right-of-way and easement herein granted is intended to convey a continuous thirty (30) foot wide strip from the south railroad right-of-way line to the north railroad right-of-way line.

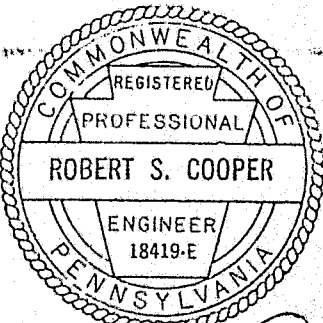

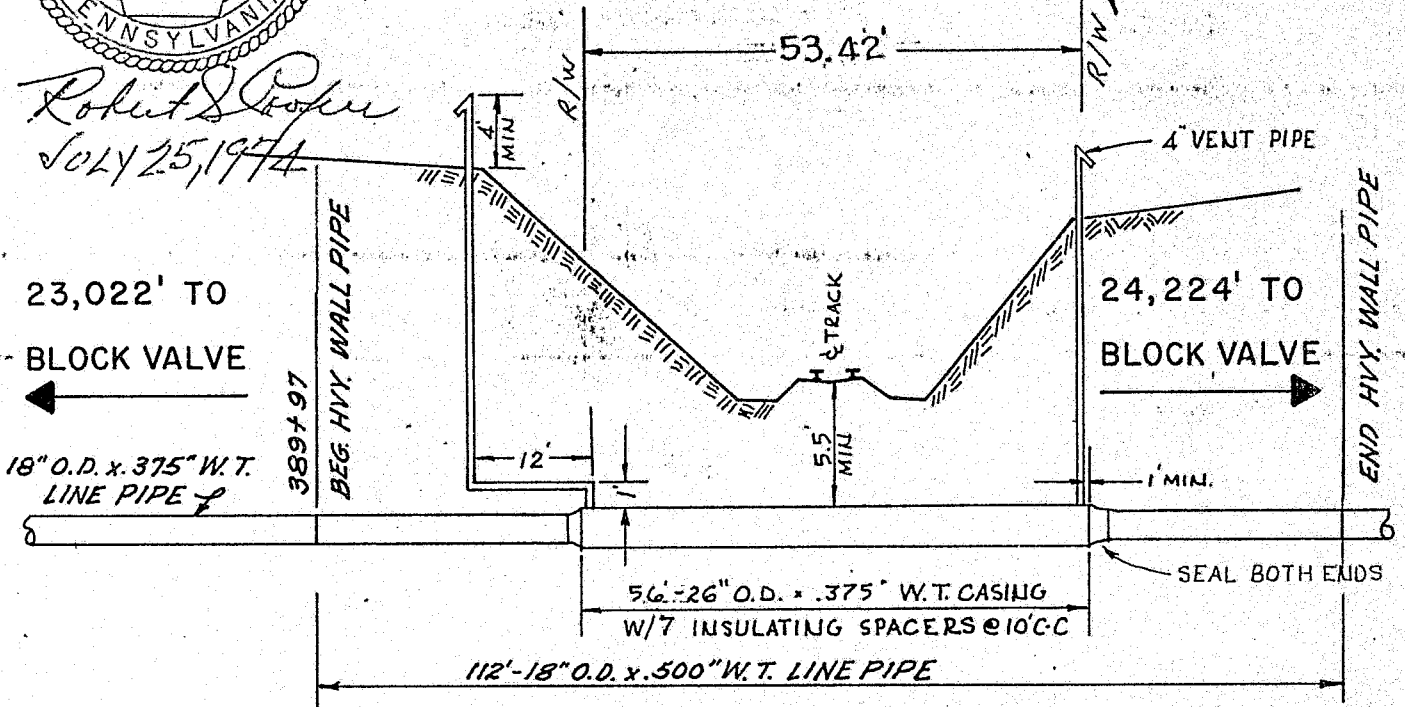

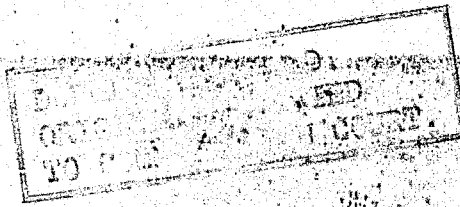
PLAN
