  - Applicant shall report to the Commission the percentages of total electricity supplied by each fuel source on an annual basis per 52 Pa. Code § 54.39(d).



**3.** Supply Price: In lieu of a Fixed Price, Customer's Price Under a variable Guaranteed Savings program, during the initial term of the Contract and all renewals the Buyer will receive a variable monthly Price that will be below the Utility rate during the annual term.
