

Applicant has four wholly-owned subsidiaries that are inactive at this time: Bidtron, LLC; Subastas de Energia, S.A de C.V. de R. L. (formed for anticipated operations in Mexico); and EMEX Canada Holdings, LLC, and EMEX Energy Canada, ULC (formed for anticipated operations in Canada).

Applicant operates web-based natural gas and electricity brokerage and reverse auction services, allowing commercial and residential customers to compare multiple price offerings from competing suppliers. This platform is a unique business resource that has created unsurpassed transparency and control of customer's costs. Applicant provides multiple products – fixed rates, variable rates and heat rates as well as analysis of market conditions and historical trends. Applicant's fully automated website and reverse auction platform simplifies the process for customers and provides the ability to easily switch to a lower cost natural gas and/or electricity provider online. Applicant provides all necessary logistics from beginning to end, including credit approvals and customer support throughout the length of a customer's contract. Applicant is a national leader in retail energy brokerage in all deregulated markets in the United States.

Summary and proof of licenses as a supplier of electric services in other states or jurisdictions.

Applicant's web based electric (and gas) brokerage business operates similarly in every other state and jurisdiction in which it operates. Applicant holds the following licenses and registrations, as applicable.

<u>Texas</u>: On January 5, 2007, Applicant started doing business in Texas as a web-based electricity brokerage business (no license is required in Texas for electricity brokers). On December 5, 2012, Applicant was registered as an aggregator in Texas under number 80368. On September 1, 2019, Texas implemented a new requirement that electricity brokers be registered and Applicant has registered accordingly and received registration # BR190088.

Illinois: On September 9, 2010, the Illinois Commerce Commission granted Applicant a Certificate of Service Authority to operate as an agent, broker or consultant for electric and gas customers pursuant to order number 10-0455.

New Jersey: On October 5, 2010, the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities registered Applicant to be an Energy Agent and Energy Consultant under registration numbers EA-0083 and EC-0024. On November 9, 2011, the New Jersey Division of Local Government Services of the Department of Community Affairs approved Applicant as a vendor pursuant to the Local Unit Electronic Technology Pilot Program, P.L. 2001, c. 30, to offer its reverse auction platform for the purchase of energy generate services by local contracting units, waiver number EMEX LLC-1. On February 20, 2013, Applicant was registered to conduct business in the State of New Jersey as a Private Aggregator. Applicant is approved to provide both electric and natural gas services to both residential and commercial customers in New Jersey.

<u>Maryland</u>: On October 13, 2010, the Maryland Public Service Commission granted Applicant a license to provide electricity broker services under license reference number IR-2065. On May 1, 2013, the Applicant's license was amended to include acting as an aggregator of electricity. On July 17, 2013, the Maryland Public Service Commission granted Applicant a license to supply natural gas or natural gas supply services in Maryland under License Reference Number IR-3115.
