
Dear Ms. Licht:

Dear Chairman Dutrieuille and Fellow Commissioners:

I have been following Francis Hriadil's case on the PUC Docket C-2016-2571726 and I am appalled at how his case has been handled by Judge Watson. The degree of unfairness and recent highly prejudicial developments is blatantly outrageous.

Judge Watson has turned a blind eye while Duquesne Light attorneys have continuously harassed Mr. Hriadil throughout his entire litigation.

Mr. Hriadil is a frail senior citizen without a legal background doing the best he can representing himself.

He has prepared the "preponderance of evidence" requested by the court and submitted all documentation needed for his November 20-21, 2019 hearing dates.

Mr. Hriadil's case has been purposely, maliciously abused by Duquesne Light attorneys submitting untimely concurrent Motions in Limine just before his November 20-21 hearing dates and Judge Watson "held the gavel" (and "seems" to be ruling in favor of Duquesne Light) ordering Mr. Hriadil to orally defend himself against two extensive Motions in Limine on the day of his hearing!
