Visit Vans LLC (“Respondent”) has paid, in full, its outstanding assessment balance for the July 1, 2017 to June 30, 2018 Fiscal Year (“2017-2018 Fiscal Year”) and the agreed-upon civil penalty to resolve the above-docketed complaint without litigation.

On or about October 9, 2019, the Commission received a money order from Respondent in the amount of \$685, which constitutes payment of Respondent’s outstanding assessment balance for the 2017-2018 Fiscal Year in the amount of \$385, as well as \$300 related to the agreed-upon civil penalty for Respondent’s failure to timely pay the Commission’s assessment and file an assessment report demonstrating its gross intrastate revenues earned during the 2016 calendar year.
