Dear Secretary Chiavetta:

In accordance with the Interim Orders issued on July 23, 2019 and October 23, 2019 in the above-referenced matter, this letter serves as a status report on behalf of Metropolitan Edison Company ("Met-Ed"). Met-Ed issued discovery to Mr. Giamoni on May 16, 2019. No response was received from Mr. Giamoni and Met-Ed filed a Motion to Compel on July 22, 2019. On July 23, 2019, Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ") Jeffrey Watson issued an Interim Order which granted the Motion to Compel and directed Mr. Giamoni to respond to the discovery requests no later than August 16, 2019. Mr. Giamoni again failed to respond, and, on August 28, 2019, Met-Ed filed a Motion to Dismiss. On September 4, 2019, ALJ Watson rescinded the Interim Order issued on July 23, 2019 which provided Mr. Giamoni with additional time to respond to Met-Ed's Motion to Compel. When no reply was received from Mr. Giamoni, ALJ Watson issued a Second Interim Order on October 11, 2019 which granted the Motion to Compel and directed Mr. Giamoni to respond to the discovery responses no later than October 30, 2019. No response was received from Mr. Giamoni, and, on November 20, 2019, Met-Ed filed an Amended Motion to Dismiss. Meanwhile, Mr. Giamoni has also failed to provide notification of her expert and factual witnesses by October 1, 2019 in accordance with the Interim Order. Met-Ed timely provided notice of its expert and factual witnesses. As such, Met-Ed anticipates that Mr. Giamoni will not be presenting testimony in this matter or, if she does, it will be limited to her own factual testimony at the time of any evidentiary hearing. Therefore, Met-Ed anticipates that it will only need to present one witness, Mr. John Ahr, in order to rebut any factual testimony offered at that time.

The Amended Motion to Dismiss filed by Met-Ed on November 20, 2019 remains pending at this point and Met-Ed believes that the Motion is ripe for decision. Alternatively, should Met-Ed's Motion to Dismiss be denied or otherwise not ruled upon, Met-Ed requests that a one-day telephonic evidentiary hearing be scheduled. Counsel for Met-Ed and its witness are available for a telephonic hearing as follows: February 4, 10, 12, 14, 18-21, or 28, 2020.
