

**COMPLAINANT'S NOTICE OF INABILITY TO ATTEND HEARING
AND REPEAT REQUEST TO TRANSFER MATTER TO NEUTRAL GROUP**

Comes now Complainant Dr. Deborah A. Redman and asks the Commission and the parties to take note that she is unable to attend a hearing on this matter due to disability, which has been exacerbated by conditions caused by Respondents FirstEnergy and Penelec.¹ She has also asked that the matter be transferred to a neutral body (that has an understanding of the requirements of the ADA). Although ALJ Long refused to grant the request, the refusal is in violation of the ADA (and plain common sense) – one of

¹ The conditions brought about by Respondents have caused ongoing destabilization of her medical condition. And Complainant will remain destabilized, as she is forced to manage all of the debris that comes down from the wisteria infestation and by the burden (well over 130 hours at this point) from communicating with the Commission in order to try to resolve what is a very simple problem: The wisteria needs to be eradicated. It is on the power lines, so therefore must be eradicated by the power companies. She is also being forced to find someone else to live, but cannot afford it – her last move cost \$25,000 – so will likely have to appeal to the public/media.

Complainant's grounds for moving that the ALJ recuse herself.² If the Commission, which has no ADA Coordinator, refuses to grant reasonable requests for accommodation, holding a one-sided hearing would be hugely discriminating.

WHEREFORE, Complainant again requests that the matter be transferred to a neutral body.
