VIASAT CARRIER SERVICES, INC. SUPPLEMENTAL RESPONSE

Viasat Carrier Services, Inc. ("Viasat"), by its counsel, hereby submits this Supplemental Response in support of its petition for designation as an eligible telecommunications carrier ("Petition") for purposes of receiving funding from the FCC's Connect America Fund Phase II Auction (Auction 903) (the "CAF II Auction") in the locations in Pennsylvania for which it was awarded funding. On February 13, 2020, Viasat received follow-up questions, requests for revisions to mock-ups of Lifeline materials, and concerns from the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (the "Commission") Bureau of Consumer Services ("BCS").¹ Viasat submitted its responses to these follow-up questions on March 17, 2020, and on March 30, 2020, BCS provided additional questions and recommended revisions to Lifeline materials.²

Minimum Service Term and Early Termination Fee

In its March 17 Supplemental Response, Viasat submitted that it would offer a variety of packages for its supported services, including packages with a one-year minimum service term. As

currently proposed, if a customer would decide to terminate service during the initial service term, \$15 per month remaining would become due. Viasat's customer agreement will allow for termination without an early termination fee by a residential voice customer for material, ongoing degradation in service quality or service interruption of a significant length of time such that the customer is not able to use the service at all or to make reasonable use of the service issues. Viasat will offer a discount for customers who purchase a bundle of voice and Internet access. Because Viasat's voice service is provided via satellite, standalone voice offerings will require a one-year minimum service term to recover the costs of installing the satellite Internet portion of the service.

As noted in the March 17 response, Lifeline customers who subscribe to standalone voice services will not be subject to a minimum service term.

BCS has requested further clarification whether the early termination fee would be charged, when applicable, in addition to the standard installation fee listed in proposed pricing submitted to in this docket on October 17, 2019. Yes, the installation fee is a separate charge from the early termination fee, and the early termination fee, if assessed, would apply when or if free standard installation is advertised as a purchase incentive. As stated previously, Viasat is still working on the details of its offerings.

Mock-Up of Advertising/Marketing Materials

BCS has requested further revisions to the mock-up of advertising/marketing materials submitted by Viasat on March 17, 2020.³ Specifically, BCS has requested that Viasat enlarge the font size to at least 8-point type. Attached as **Attachment A** is a revised mock-up of advertising and marketing materials, revised to enlarge the font of the text on Page 2.

Voice Addendum

Attached as **Attachment B** is a revised disclosure to customers regarding number portability to clarify that consumers should not terminate or discontinue existing service when switching to a new carrier, whether to or from Viasat.

Lifeline Program Addendum

Attached as **Attachment C** is a revised mock-up Lifeline Program Addendum. Specifically, paragraph 13 is revised to address BCS' requests for further details and clarification about the availability of toll limitation and battery back-up power.

Mock-Up Bill Insert

BCS has submitted a request for revision of the mock-up bill insert as provided in September 2019. Viasat submitted a revised mock-up for prospective customers and bill insert on February 3, 2020, and believes it has addressed the request for clarification that the monthly Lifeline discount applies to voice or broadband and that the eligibility criteria for voice service and broadband service are the same.

BCS reviewed the February 3 submission, and has requested additional revisions to the mock-up Lifeline materials. See **Attachment D** for the revised Mock-Up Bill Insert adding the word "or" to clarify that the Lifeline discount applies to either voice or broadband. BCS requested the addition of other text which, upon review of the document filed in the docket, is already contained in the mock-up submitted previously.

Viasat offers Lifeline plans for home phone service or broadband (internet) service. While Viasat offers a enrollment, fine or imprisonment, or may be barred from the program. range of packages, the Lifeline discount is limited to [describe standalone voice offering and broadband offering that meets minimum standards required for Lifeline discount and include speed/usage allowance per FCC rule in effect at time of offering; see 47 CFR 54.408].

If you qualify for the Lifeline discount service, you are eligible to receive a reduced rate on your Viasat monthly bill. Qualifications for the Lifeline discount program vary by state. See below for information about Pennsylvania's Lifeline program qualification requirements. Only eligible customers may enroll.

Toll blocking is available at no charge to Lifeline customers. Some states also provide a discount on the cost of installing new home phone service to customers living on tribal lands.

Only one Lifeline discount is allowed per household and a household is not permitted to receive multiple Lifeline benefits from multiple providers. Lifeline service is a non-transferable benefit.

Other providers may use terms other than "Lifeline" to describe the Lifeline assistance program. If you are receiving a discount from another provider you are not eligible for the Lifeline discount with Viasat.

You must meet certain qualifications for the Lifeline discount and you will be required to provide proof of participation in an eligible program, or your income must be at or below the established guidelines. In addition to receiving an application and, where required, program proof, Viasat is required to access the National Lifeline Accountability Database to verify 1) you are not already receiving the Lifeline benefit from another wireline, wireless or broadband service provider and 2) your identity based on your full name, date of birth and the last 4 digits of your Social Security Number.

Attachment B

Voice Addendum (Excerpt)

6. Additional Terms. You agree to the following additional terms and conditions while using Voice:

A. Subject to the limitations in Section 6.B. below, Viasat will transfer (“port”) your existing wireline or wireless telephone number for use with Voice. Do not terminate your service with Viasat or your existing company before initiating new service with Viasat or another company. It will take approximately 5-10 business days after you order Voice to port your existing telephone number. Cancellations or changes to a port request within 72 hours of a scheduled port may result in additional fees. Viasat will port your telephone number from Voice to another carrier at the request of that carrier, upon termination of your Voice Service. Again, do not terminate your service with Viasat or your existing company before initiating new service with Viasat or another company. If no such request is made from another carrier, Viasat may transfer your number back to the underlying telephone number provider, in which case your number may no longer be available to you. Further, in the event your Voice Service is disconnected by Viasat for non-compliance with the terms of this Addendum or the Customer Agreement, Viasat may, unless you promptly authorize another carrier to request that your number be ported, transfer your number back to the underlying telephone number provider, in which case your number may no longer be available to you.

Attachment C

Draft/Mock-Up Viasat Lifeline Program Addendum

This Viasat Lifeline Program Addendum (the "Lifeline Addendum") only applies to customers who are qualified to, and are receiving, Viasat Internet or Voice Service through a federal or state Connect America Fund program, or other similar program as designated by Viasat, and through a state or federal lifeline program ("Lifeline Service"). For Lifeline Service, all terms and conditions of the Customer Agreement apply, as well as these supplemental terms:

1. As part of your receiving Lifeline Service, Viasat will discount your monthly Service fee for your Internet or Voice Service the amount of the then current federal or state discount (as applicable). The Lifeline Service discount will appear on your bill as a separate line item labeled "**Lifeline Discount.**"
2. You understand that Lifeline is a government assistance program, that the service is non-transferrable, that only eligible consumers may enroll in the program, and the program is limited to one discount per household.
3. You are only eligible for Lifeline Service if you (or your dependent or other person in your household) currently get benefits from the government program(s) listed on the Lifeline Program Application Form (FCC Form 5629) or your annual household income is 135% or less than the Federal Poverty Guidelines (the amount listed in the Federal Poverty Guidelines table on the Lifeline Program Application Form (FCC Form 5629)).
4. You understand that your household can only get one Lifeline Service benefit, and, to the best of your knowledge, your household is not getting more than one Lifeline Service benefit. A "household" is any individual or group of individuals who are living together at the same address as one economic unit. A household may include related and unrelated persons. An "economic unit" consists of all adult individuals contributing to and sharing in the income and expenses of a household. An adult is any person eighteen years or older. If an adult has no or minimal income, and lives with someone who provides financial support to him/her, both people shall be considered part of the same household. Children under the age of eighteen living with their parents or guardians are considered to be part of the same household as their parents or guardians.
5. You agree that if you move you will give Viasat your new address within 30 days. You understand that you must notify Viasat within 30 days if you do not qualify for Lifeline Service anymore, including if:
 - a. You, or the person in your household that qualified, no longer qualify for any reason (such as, no longer qualifying through a government program or based on household income level).
 - b. Either you or someone in your household gets more than one Lifeline Service benefit (including, more than one lifeline broadband internet service, more than one lifeline telephone service, or both lifeline telephone and lifeline broadband internet services).

6. You agree that Viasat can give the Lifeline Service program administrator (“Administrator”) all of the information you provided on the Lifeline Program Application Form (FCC Form 5629). You understand that this information is meant to help run the Lifeline Service program and that if you do not let Viasat give it to the Administrator, you will not be able to receive Lifeline Service benefits. You can also apply for Lifeline Service directly with the Administrator through the National Verifier, available at <https://www.lifelinesupport.org/national-verifier/> .
7. Security. You agree to take reasonable measures to protect the security of any devices you connect to the internet through the Service, including, without limitation, maintaining an up-to-date version of anti-virus and/or firewall software to protect your devices from malicious code, programs or other internal components (such as a computer virus, computer worm, computer time bomb or similar component). You expressly agree that if your computer or an internet connected device becomes infected and causes any of the prohibited activities listed in the Acceptable Use Policy, Viasat may immediately suspend your Service until such time as your computer is sufficiently protected to prevent further prohibited activities. You will be fully liable for all monthly fees and other charges under this Agreement during any period of suspension. Although Viasat has no obligation to monitor the Services or its network, Viasat and its authorized suppliers reserve the right to monitor bandwidth, usage, transmissions, and content from time to time in order to operate the Services, identify violations of this Agreement, or protect the Viasat network, the Services and other users of the Services. In all cases, you are solely responsible for the security of any device you choose to connect to the Service, including, without limitation, the security of any data stored or shared on such device(s). Viasat customer service representatives are available to Lifeline customers who need assistance obtaining access to free anti-virus software.
8. All the answers and agreements that you provided on Lifeline Program Application Form (FCC Form 5629) are true and correct to the best of your knowledge. You understand that willingly giving false or fraudulent information to get Lifeline Service program benefits is punishable by law and can result in fines, jail time, de-enrollment, or being barred from the program.
9. Viasat or the National Verifier may have to check whether you still qualify at any time. If you need to recertify (renew) your Lifeline Service benefit, you understand that you have to respond by the applicable deadline communicated to you or you will be removed from the Lifeline Service program and your Lifeline Service benefit will stop.
10. You may transfer your Lifeline benefit to another Lifeline service provider at no charge for the transfer of benefits to another provider.
11. You were truthful about whether or not you are a resident of Tribal lands, as defined in section 2 of the Lifeline Program Application Form (FCC Form 5629).
12. De-enrollment. If you become ineligible for the Lifeline Program, you have an obligation to contact Viasat directly and de-enroll from the Lifeline-supported service. There are several other situations that might result in your being de-enrolled from Lifeline Discounts:
 - a. If Viasat has a reasonable basis to believe that you are no longer eligible, Viasat will send you a notice of impending termination of the Lifeline benefit. You will have 30 days from the date of the impending termination letter to demonstrate continued eligibility by re-certifying your continued eligibility. Viasat must terminate your Lifeline benefit if you fail to demonstrate continued eligibility within the 30-day time period.

- b. If USAC, the administrator of universal service, provides notification to Viasat that you have more than one discounted account, or that more than one member of your household is receiving service, Viasat must de-enroll you from the Lifeline program within five business days.
 - c. You have an obligation to re-certify annually that only one member of your household receives program-supported service and that you continue to be eligible. If you fail to respond to Viasat's or the National Verifier's request for certification, Viasat or the National Verifier will provide you with notification that you have 60 days from the date of the notification to provide the requested certification. If you fail to provide the requested certification within the 60-day notification period, Viasat will de-enroll you from the Lifeline program within five business days from the end of the 60-day notification period.
13. Viasat Voice. Viasat Voice provides unlimited local and long distance calling to destinations in all 50 states, plus Canada. Fees apply for calls outside of these locations. You may contact Viasat at [number to be provided] to block calls that could result in additional fees. Call blocking, also known as toll limitation, is offered at no charge to Lifeline customers. Further, you may purchase a battery backup; we offer 8- and 24-hour options for a one-time fee of \$__ and \$__ respectively.
14. EasyCare Plan is optional for Lifeline subscribers. Viasat will provide EasyCare to Lifeline subscribers who elect the service free for the first 90 days. For more detail, see the EasyCare Plan Addendum.⁴
15. *If you are unable to resolve a dispute with Viasat, you may contact the Pennsylvania Public Utilities Commission's Bureau of Consumer Services (BCS). BCS will address Lifeline-related issues that include (1) eligibility disputes; (2) program offering issues; and (3) limited equipment-related issues. Viasat Lifeline Program Offerings

What is Lifeline? Lifeline is a government assistance program supported by the Federal Communications Commission. Viasat Carrier Services, Inc. ("Viasat") offers the following Lifeline-supported services as an Eligible Telecommunications Carrier:

- Voice - \$7.25 monthly discount or
- Broadband Internet Access Service - \$9.25 monthly discount

Who can enroll in Viasat's Lifeline program? Only eligible consumers may enroll in the following programs:

- You may qualify for [INSERT OFFER NAMES] service if you can show proof that you or another person in your household participates in certain government assistance programs listed below or your annual income is 135% or below the Federal Poverty Guidelines. If you qualify based on income, you will be required to provide income verification. For a list of qualifying government assistance programs and income guidelines, please see the Viasat application form.
- You may qualify for Lifeline Broadband (internet) service if you can show proof that you participate in certain government assistance programs or your annual income is 135% or below the Federal Poverty Guidelines. If you qualify based on income, you will be required to provide income verification. Lifeline service is non-transferable, and only eligible consumers may enroll in the program.

The Lifeline program is limited to one discount per household. Each household can receive one Lifeline benefits from only one company, which can be a broadband, wireline or wireless service provider. Lifeline cannot be transferred to another person, but you can keep the Lifeline benefit if you move to another address. You must activate your service. Lifeline is a federal benefit. Willingly making false statements to obtain the benefit can result in fines, imprisonment, de-enrollment, or being barred from the program. Proof of eligibility is required, and only eligible customers may enroll. You will be required to recertify your eligibility for the program each year. If circumstances change and you are no longer eligible for Lifeline, you must inform Viasat within 30 days.

Where can I find the application for Viasat's Lifeline services? You must meet certain eligibility requirements in order to qualify for Viasat's Lifeline service.
