MOTION FOR CONTINUANCE

TO ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE STEVE HASS:

Columbia Gas of Pennsylvania, Inc. (“Columbia” or the “Company”), by and through its counsel, files this Motion for Continuance, pursuant to Section 1.15 of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission’s (“Commission”) regulations, 52 Pa. Code § 1.15.

In support thereof, Columbia states as follows:

1. On February 28, 2020, Bryan Tate (“Complainant”) filed a Formal Complaint (“Complaint”) against Columbia.
2. On March 23, 2020, Columbia filed an Answer to Mr. Tate’s complaint.
3. By Hearing Notice dated April 29, 2020, a telephonic hearing is scheduled in this matter for Wednesday, May 27, 2020 at 10:00 a.m. before Administrative Law Judge (“ALJ”) Steve Hass.
4. The Complaint includes a multitude of allegations, including violations of the Commission’s regulations. In preparation for the hearing scheduled for May 27, 2020, Columbia has determined that at least one additional witness is necessary for Columbia to adequately present its position at the hearing and respond to the various allegations within the Complaint. Thus, Columbia requires additional time to identify the additional witness and prepare for the hearing.
5. Columbia requests that the hearing in this matter be continued for thirty (30) days.

6. The Complainant is under no threat of having service terminated at S. 52 Pine Street, York, PA.


7. Further, Columbia has suspended the meter relocation project at S. 52 Pine Street, York, PA, while this matter is pending before the Commission.
