3. Buckeye Pipe Line Company (hereinafter sometimes referred to as "Buckeye") is an Ohio corporation chartered originally on March 31, 1886. Essentially it is an interstate carrier of petroleum and petroleum products by pipe line, and with various divisions in the east and midwest Buckeye over the years has established a comprehensive common carrier petroleum and petroleum products pipe line system,

including in its development in Pennsylvania acquisition in 1960 of Tuscarora Pipe Line Ltd. Attached hereto is a map showing the Buckeye pipe line system.

4. The Tuscarora System extends from Macungie, near Allentown, Pennsylvania, westward to Pittsburgh and to the Ohio River at Midland, Pennsylvania, and enables Buckeye to provide common carrier pipe line transportation originating in the refining areas of Linden, New Jersey, in interstate commerce, in and across Pennsylvania. The Tuscarora system consists of approximately 300 miles of pipe line and there are delivery terminals near Reading, Harrisburg, Altoona, Johnstown, Pittsburgh and Midland. See map. These facilities provide shippers who wish to use Buckeye's service with economically safe and continuous delivery of adequate supplies of petroleum and petroleum products to industrial centers and other distributing points, to and for the Pennsylvania public.

One segment of this line is already authorized for use in intrastate operations by this Commission, in order that Buckeye may provide transportation eastwardly out of Midland to Pittsburgh: Order of the Commission, dated January 8, 1962, at Application Docket No. 88470. This transportation was necessitated when Humble Oil and Refining Company sought to supply its Pittsburgh terminal by using inland-waters and its own barges from Baton-Rouge, Louisiana, to Midland, Pennsylvania, and desired Buckeye's service for delivery of its products between Midland and Pittsburgh by use of Buckeye's Tuscarora line.

5. Buckeye by this application seeks the approval of the Commission for the beginning of the exercise of the additional right, power, or privilege of transporting, storing and distributing petroleum and petroleum products by means of pipe lines and appurtenances, such facilities extending eastwardly from Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, to Macungie, Lehigh County, Pennsylvania.

6. In providing the proposed service Buckeye will utilize the existing Tuscarora pipe line and related facilities, although the direction of the flow will be changed for the service.

7. Buckeye is an established carrier in Pennsylvania and is complying with all existing laws necessary to its right to do business in Pennsylvania as a foreign public utility. It is financially fit and particularly qualified in the rendition of common carrier pipe line transportation. Incorporated herein by reference are its Annual Reports on file with the Commission for the information of the Commission.

8. There is no other certificated common carrier by pipe line available for the transportation contemplated.

9. Approval of this application is necessary and proper for the service, accommodation, convenience and safety of the public for the following reasons:

(a) Although Buckeye's existing Tuscarora line provides shippers with pipe line transportation from a point of origin in Linden, New Jersey, westward to Pittsburgh, there is a demand for transportation eastwardly using Buckeye's Tuscarora line.

(b) If Buckeye is to continue to serve its existing customers, it is necessary that Buckeye secure requisite Commission approval.

(c) Approval of the application will permit Buckeye to provide in intrastate service as an additional right that service which is provided interstate to shippers, although the direction of the flow will be reversed for this service.


(d) No adverse competitive situation will be created by the grant of such authority.

10. For the reasons stated herein it is respectfully submitted that the Commission should approve this application, in order that service can be provided to shippers and the public generally from Midland-Pittsburgh to Macungie, including intermediate points, via Buckeye's Tuscarora line.

WHEREFORE, Buckeye Pipe Line Company, applicant herein, prays your Honorable Commission to issue a Certificate of Public Convenience evidencing the approval of the beginning of the exercise of the additional right, power, or privilege of transporting, storing, and distributing petroleum and petroleum products by means of pipe line and appurtenances, for the public, such facilities being existing facilities extending eastwardly from Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, to Macungie, Lehigh County, Pennsylvania.

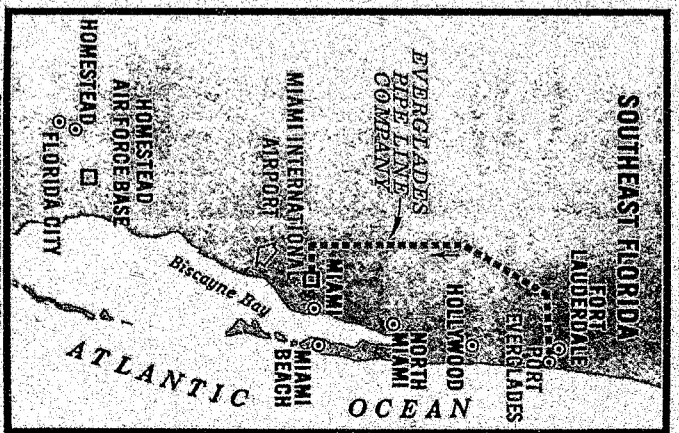
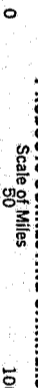

PETITION FOR SPECIAL PERMISSION

TO THE HONORABLE, THE PENNSYLVANIA PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION:

COMES NOW, Buckeye Pipe Line Company, by its attorneys,  
Metzger, Hafer, Keefer, Thomas and Wood, and respectfully petitions  
the Commission for special permission to begin the exercise of the  
additional right, power and privilege of transporting petroleum and  
petroleum products by means of pipe line for Humble Oil and Refining  
Company and Phillips Petroleum Corporation from Pittsburgh, Allegheny  
County, to East Freedom, Blair County, Pennsylvania, and in support  
thereof, respectfully represents:

1. Simultaneously herewith, Buckeye Pipe Line Company (hereinafter  
sometimes called "Buckeye"), an Ohio corporation, has filed its  
application with the Commission for approval of the beginning of the  
exercise of the additional right, power, and privilege of trans-  
porting petroleum and petroleum products by pipe line to and for the

public for compensation between points within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, as more fully set forth in its application.

2. Buckeye Pipe Line Company chartered in 1886 is essentially an interstate carrier of petroleum and petroleum products by pipe line, and with various divisions in the east and midwest it has over the years established a comprehensive common carrier petroleum and petroleum products pipe line system, including in its development in Pennsylvania acquisition in 1960 of Tuscarora Pipe Line Ltd.

3. The Tuscarora system extends from Macungie, near Allentown, Pennsylvania, westward to Pittsburgh and to the Ohio River at Midland, Pennsylvania, and enables Buckeye to provide common carrier pipe line transportation originating in the refining areas of Linden, New Jersey, in interstate commerce, in and across Pennsylvania. The Tuscarora system consists of approximately 300 miles of pipe line and there are delivery terminals near Reading, Harrisburg, Altoona, Johnstown, Pittsburgh and Midland. These facilities provide shippers who wish to use Buckeye's service with economically safe and continuous delivery of adequate supplies of petroleum and petroleum products to industrial centers and other distributing points, to and for the Pennsylvania public. One segment of the line is already authorized for use in intrastate commerce by this Commission, in order that Buckeye may provide intrastate pipe line transportation eastwardly out of Midland to Pittsburgh; Order of the Commission, dated January 8, 1962, at Application Docket No. 88470. This transportation was necessitated when Humble Oil and Refining Company sought to supply its

Pittsburgh terminal by using inland-waters and its own barges from Baton Rouge, Louisiana, to Midland, Pennsylvania, and desired Buckeye's service for delivery of its products between Midland and Pittsburgh, via Buckeye's Tuscarora line.

4. This request for special permission is necessitated by further requirements of Humble Oil and Refining Company, as well as that of Phillips Petroleum Corporation, for transportation eastwardly from Midland-Pittsburgh to other points on Buckeye's Tuscarora line. Due to an acute shortage of coastal tankers and tanker space, these shippers presently engaged in Gulf Coast shipping in delivery of their products to the east coast, intend to use the inland-waters and barges for delivery of their products to Midland, and desire further transportation eastwardly by Buckeye using the Tuscarora line. It is anticipated that the requirements of these shippers will vary between 10,000 and 12,000 barrels daily and Buckeye has been further advised that there is an immediate need, and an emergency, for this transportation, commencing October 15, 1967, to East Freedom (near Altoona), including service to terminals at Pittsburgh, Indiana, Indianola and East Freedom.

5. Buckeye in providing this service will utilize the existing Tuscarora pipe line facilities, although the direction of the flow will be changed for this service. There is no other certificated common carrier by pipe line available for the transportation contemplated.

6. Since its acquisition of the Tuscarora pipe line facilities Buckeye has provided shippers with pipe line transportation from a point

of origin in Linden, New Jersey, westward to Pittsburgh. Therefore, it is respectfully submitted that Buckeye should be permitted to provide in intrastate service as an additional right that service which is provided shippers in interstate commerce. No adverse competitive situation will be created by the grant of such authority.

WHEREFORE, Buckeye Pipe Line Company, by its attorneys, prays that its petition for special permission be granted and that the Commission do so by:

(a) Granting Buckeye Pipe Line Company special permission to provide service for Humble Oil and Refining Company and Phillips Petroleum Corporation from Pittsburgh to East Freedom, including intermediate points, pending disposition of its application concurrently filed herewith.


(b) Permitting Buckeye Pipe Line Company to file an appropriate tariff covering this service, effective on one day's notice.
