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INTRODUCTORY STATEMENT

This brief is being filed to help Judge Watson review all of the evidence and for me to clarify issues in the transcript, proceedings and formal complaint so he can make his initial decision.

QUESTIONS AND ISSUES

- I. The issues in the original Customer Formal Complaint Jon Allen Hribal - all of this should be taken into account.

- II. The increase of radio frequency (RF) and electromagnetic fields (EMF) grows greater every day with signal boosters in buildings for Wifi, phones, video surveillance, etc. Regulatory bodies give individual industries whatever amount of harmful pollution they need to operate (acceptable limits), but seem to forget about the cumulative big picture of all those industries that put out the same type of pollutants - and in this case, RF and EMF. Why don't regulatory agencies take this into consideration? Because big business is so powerful and politicians want jobs so nothing else matters.
- III. Rep. Mike Reese introduced House Bill 310-313 that shows that all is not right with House Bill 2200 and Act 129.
- IV. House Bill 2200 and Act 129 are unconstitutional per Article I Declaration of Rights Sec. 2 Political Powers - "All power is inherent in the people and all free governments are founded on their authority and instituted for their peace, safety and happiness. For the advancement of these ends they have at all times an inalienable and indefeasible right to alter, reform or abolish their government in such manner as they may think proper."
- V. All of Ms. Giesler's exhibits should be removed from the records and transcripts because she didn't have the people that actually wrote the exhibits there for me to cross examine and per Ms. Giesler, that would be hearsay.
- VI. All the testimony that Mr. Ahr gave to the exhibits should be struck as hearsay.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

- I. House Bill 2200 and Act 129 are unconstitutional per the PA Constitution.
- II. The types of liability that West Penn Power refuses to take responsibility for are meters causing fires, explosions of meters and all kinds of health concerns.
- III. Other House Bills are being considered to replace House Bill 2200 and Act 129.
- IV. House Bill 2200 and Act 129 changed the way the PA PUC did business in the past, PA PUC no longer represents the consumer, it represents the industries.
- V. House Bill 2200 and Act 129 makes having a smart meter a law, RF and EMF are cumulative and do harm to all living things. As for wifi routers, microwave ovens and remote controls - we have a choice whether we have them or not.
- VI. The PA PUC and attorneys have made it too hard for a person to have a grievance filed without an attorney. Between the cost of attorneys fees, and all the rules, title 66-55-52 etc., it has taken over a year for me to fight this on my own. This must be shortened and simplified.

ARGUMENT

- I. The PA PUC system is broken and needs to be rebuilt.
- II. Act 129 doesn't allow the PA PUC to do what it was originally intended to do.
- III. Attorneys and courts have taken over to make this whole process just a money making scheme and to deter people from taking on a utility and PA PUC. Between the cost and

length of time, who can afford to do this? Until I get through this, if it goes to the PA Supreme Court it could be years and cost a fortune. I could die of old age by then. The system needs to know it's time to fight this to the bitter end. Even if I win, in the end I lose because of all the years it takes to fight this. The utilities, attorneys, courts and PA PUC get what they want!

- IV. The health issues alone, not to mention the liability aforementioned, should have stopped this law from happening.

CONCLUSION

The Ten Commandments are on one stone tablet.

The Declaration of Independence is on one piece of parchment.

The Constitution is on four pieces of parchment.

The Bill of Rights is on one piece of parchment.

What happened to our government? The laws, codes, rules, etc. that one has to deal with in order to go in front of the PA PUC and file a grievance against the utilities is hundreds and hundreds of pages and there is no way of knowing what goes with what. That needs to be changed.
