



COMPLAINT UPON COMMISSION MOTION

BY THE COMMISSION:

NOW, to wit, June 8, 1984 the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission hereby institutes a complaint upon its own motion against Fischer-Hughes Transport, Incorporated and complains as follows:

(1) Fischer-Hughes Transport, Incorporated is a holder of a certificate of public convenience issued at the above application docket number.

(2) Fischer-Hughes Transport, Incorporated has failed to file on March 7, 1984 evidence of cargo liability insurance as required by the Public Utility Law and the rules and regulations promulgated by the Commission thereunder.

In the performance of our regulatory function, we find it appropriate and proper in the public interest to require respondent to show cause why the certificate of public convenience issued at the above application docket number should not be cancelled for the reason aforesaid; THEREFORE,


IT IS ORDERED:

1. That a complaint is hereby entered at the above docket number and against respondent herein to show cause why the certificate of public convenience issued at said application docket number should not be cancelled.

2. That answer to the instant complaint be filed with the Commission in writing and under oath within thirty (30) days of the mailing date of this order. Said answer to set forth in reasonable detail legal or factual reasons why the certificate of public convenience should not be cancelled for the reasons stated herein.

3. That in absence of answer or upon respondent's filing answers and not objecting to the averments herein, such action shall be disposed by the Commission without hearing as it may deem appropriate, otherwise hearing shall be held on the complaint at a time and place to be set by the Commission.



ORDER DISMISSING COMPLAINT

BY THE COMMISSION:

This matter comes before us upon complaint on our motion alleging that Fischer-Hughes Transport, Inc., holder of a certificate of public convenience issued March 2, 1983 has failed to file on March 7, 1984, evidence of cargo liability insurance as required by the Public Utility Law and the rules and regulations promulgated by the Commission, thereunder. Upon full investigation of the matter, it appears that after the complaint was instituted on June 8, 1984, evidence of insurance was received June 22, 1984; THEREFORE,

IT IS ORDERED: That the complaint issued in this proceeding be and is hereby dismissed subject to the payment of a fifty dollar (\$50.00) fine for failure to keep evidence of continuous insurance on file with the Commission, said payment to be made within thirty (30) days of the entered date of this order.
