

PENNSYLVANIA-AMERICAN WATER COMPANY

Pennsylvania-American Water Company, an investor-owned water company, with corporate offices at 852 Wesley Drive, Mechanicsburg, is a subsidiary of American Water Works Company, Inc. On February 1, 1989, the then-existing Pennsylvania-American Water Company (the result of the January 1, 1987 merger of Riverton Consolidated Water Company with and into Keystone Water Company) was merged with and into Western Pennsylvania Water Company, and the name of the surviving corporation was changed to Pennsylvania-American Water Company. The corporate history of each of the predecessor companies follows.

Riverton Consolidated Water Company

Riverton Consolidated Water Company ("Riverton") was the product of the merger and consolidation of six companies on February 17, 1904: Riverton Water Company (incorporated June 2, 1892); The Susquehanna Water Supply Company (incorporated December 6, 1897); East Pennsboro Water Company (incorporated December 9, 1901); Allen Spring Water Company (incorporated December 11, 1901); Fairview Township Water Company (incorporated December 31, 1903); and The Mountain Water Company of New Cumberland (incorporated February 20, 1896).

On January 14, 1929, Riverton acquired the franchises and property of Shiremanstown Water Company (incorporated August 31, 1903), West Shore Water Company (incorporated February 2, 1910) and Hampden Water Company (incorporated March 9, 1927). Letters Patent in connection with the merger of Silver Spring Water Company (incorporated December 16, 1910) into Riverton were issued on March 29, 1966.

Riverton purchased three additional water companies before its merger into Keystone Water Company: Hampden Water Company (incorporated October 5, 1971 to serve the Ridgeland/Ridgeland Farms portion of Hampden Township, Cumberland County), acquired August 28, 1985; Summerdale Water Company (incorporated April 16, 1973 to serve the Summerdale portion of East Pennsboro Township, Cumberland County), acquired March 13, 1986; and Forge Road Acres Water Company (incorporated May 13, 1965 to serve the Forge Road Acres portion of South Middleton Township, Cumberland County), acquired December 30, 1986.

At the time of the 1987 merger, Riverton supplied water to all or portions of 12 municipalities on the Harrisburg west shore, Cumberland County, and Fairview Township, York County.

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### Keystone Water Company

Keystone Water Company ("Keystone") was formed by the merger of 14 operating water companies with and into White Deer Mountain Water Company on July 31, 1973: The Bangor Water Company, The Berwick Water Company, Biglerville Water Company, Canawacta Water Supply Company, The Clark's Summit Water Company, The Consumers Water Company of Montrose, Pennsylvania, The Hallstead Water Company, Moshannon Valley Water Company, The Mountain City Water Company, Norristown Water Company, Northumberland Water Company, Palmyra Water Company, The Thompson Borough Water Company, and Yardley Water Company.

White Deer Mountain Water Company was incorporated September 27, 1899. On March 1, 1929, the company acquired all the assets and franchises of Citizens Water Company of Milton, East Buffalo Water Company, Kelly Water Company, The Lewisburg Water Company, Mountain Water Company, The Watsonstown Water Company, White Deer Creek Water Supply Company and Mountain Water Ice Company.

The Bangor Water Company was incorporated June 17, 1884. On August 18, 1941, it acquired all of the franchises and property of Roseto Water Company. On June 12, 1967 it acquired The Bangor Plainfield Water Company, The Bangor Washington Water Company and Joseph H. Beers, t/a West Bangor Water Company.

The Berwick Water Company was incorporated March 13, 1818. On February 16, 1931, it acquired all of the franchises and property of Briarcreek Water Supply Company, West Berwick Water Supply Company and West Salem Water Supply Company. It acquired Nescopeck Water Supply Company on October 8, 1931.

Biglerville Water Company was incorporated September 5, 1908.

Canawacta Water Supply Company was incorporated November 24, 1899. It acquired all of the franchises and property of The Susquehanna Water Company and The Lanesboro Water Company on January 18, 1930.

The Clark's Summit Water Company was incorporated February 14, 1893. The company acquired North Abington Water Company on May 1, 1929.

The Consumers Water Company of Montrose, Pennsylvania was incorporated August 31, 1892.

The Hallstead Water Company was incorporated April 14, 1892. On January 18, 1930, it acquired all of the franchises and property of The Great Bend Water Company.

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Moshannon Valley Water Company was incorporated in the name of The Citizens Water Company on July 21, 1904 by Agreement of Merger and Consolidation between The Citizens Water Company and The Philipsburg Water Company. On October 15, 1923, by Agreement of Consolidation and Merger between The Citizens Water Company, Cold Spring Water Company, The Home Water Company of South Philipsburg, The Peoples Water Company of Rush Township and Decatur Water Company, The Citizens Water Company was reorganized. On February 21, 1928, the name of the company was changed to Citizens Water Service Company. On December 31, 1969, Moshannon Valley Water Company was formed by virtue of a Plan and Agreement of Merger between The Osceola Water Supply Company and Morris Water Company into Citizens Water Service Company.

The Mountain City Water Company was incorporated April 7, 1883.

Norristown Water Company was incorporated April 6, 1925. On August 6, 1907, it acquired all of the property and rights of Norristown Insurance and Water Company. On March 29, 1963, The Bridgeport Water Company, Inter-Township Water Company, Providence Water Supply Company, West Norriton Water Company and Whippain Water Company were merged into Norristown Water Company by virtue of an Agreement of Merger. The Company acquired all of the assets and franchises of Worcester Township Water Company on February 12, 1970.

Northumberland Water Company was incorporated on July 19, 1892.

Palmyra Water Company was formed on January 27, 1921 by the merger of North Annville Water Supply Corporation and Gravel Hill Water Supply Corporation into North Annville and Gravel Hill Consolidated Water Supply Company. On November 8, 1929, the company acquired Londonderry Water Company. The name of the company was changed to Palmyra Water Company on November 7, 1930.

The Thompson Borough Water Company was originally incorporated on July 24, 1891.

Yardley Water Company was incorporated on December 19, 1900 as Yardley Water and Power Company. On April 16, 1958, the Company's name was changed to Yardley Water Company.

The Biglerville District (formerly Biglerville Water Company) of Keystone was sold to the Biglerville Borough Authority in 1981.

Keystone purchased four water systems before its merger with Riverton: Hershey Water Company (incorporated May 13, 1913 to serve the town of Hershey, Dauphin County), merged into Keystone October 1, 1982; Annville Township Authority system (organized March 15, 1965 to serve portions of Annville, North Annville and South Annville Townships, Lebanon County),

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acquired July 11, 1985; B & J Water Company (incorporated June 10, 1965 to serve Carol Acres portion of Derry Township, Dauphin County), acquired July 30, 1986; Glenburn Water Company ([not a corporation] started in 1912 to serve a portion of Glenburn Township, Lackawanna County).

At the time of the 1987 merger, Keystone provided service through 14 district offices (Abington, Bangor, Berwick, Frackville, Hallstead, Hershey/Palmyra, Montrose, Moshannon Valley, Norristown, Northumberland, Susquehanna, Thompson, White Deer [Milton] and Yardley) to portions of 14 eastern Pennsylvania counties: Bucks, Centre, Clearfield, Columbia, Dauphin, Lackawanna, Lebanon, Luzerne, Montgomery, Northampton, Northumberland, Schuylkill, Susquehanna and Union.

### Western Pennsylvania Water Company

Western Pennsylvania Water Company ("WPW") resulted from the merger of 16 operating water companies with and into South Pittsburgh Water Company at various times during the years 1970, 1972 and 1973: November 30, 1970 - Monongahela Valley Water Corporation; January 31, 1972 - The Monongahela City Water Company; June 2, 1972 - The Butler Water Company, The Citizens Water Company of Washington, Pa. and New Castle Water Company; October 2, 1972 - Armstrong Water Company, Clarion Water Company, Clymer Water Service Company, The Connellsville Water Company, Ellwood Consolidated Water Company, Punxsutawney Water Service Company, Spring Water Company of Kane, Uniontown Water Company, The Warren Water Company, West Penn Water Company; February 9, 1973 - Westland Water Company. The Company's name was changed from South Pittsburgh Water Company to Western Pennsylvania Water Company on June 2, 1972.

South Pittsburgh Water Company was incorporated on July 15, 1904. On August 18, 1904, the company acquired the assets and franchises of West Liberty Water Company, Thornburg Water Company, Snowden Water Supply Company, Shirland Water Company, Superior Water Company, Scotia Water Supply Company, Stowe Water Company, Niagara Water Company, Mechanics Water Company, Green Tree Water Company, Goodwin Water Company, Farmers Water Company, Collier Water Supply Company, Carnegie Water Company, Banksville Water Company, Bethel Water Company, Beechcliff Water Company, Germania Water Company, Montooth Water Company, Lower St. Clair Water Company, Lafayette Water Company, Hilltop Water Supply Company, Highland Water Company and Hays Water Company. On October 26 of that year, it acquired all of the assets and franchises of Heidelberg Water Company. The company acquired Whitaker Water Company and Chartiers Valley Water Company on March 24, 1939. On November 3, 1960, South Pittsburgh acquired South Fayette Township Water Company. On July 1, 1969, the company acquired all of the assets and franchises of the municipal authority of the Borough of Finleyville, having previously acquired all of the assets and franchises of two

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"paper companies" in this connection, namely Finleyville Water Company and Union Water Company, on June 20, 1969. On November 21, 1969, it acquired Hill Station Water Company.

Armstrong Water Company was incorporated on August 27, 1886. On August 9, 1891, it acquired Kittanning Water Company, and on May 29, 1907, it acquired all of the assets and franchises of Manor Township Water Company, Nealon Water Company, Citizens Water Company of Kittanning, Pa., Rayburn Water Company, Manorville Water Company and West Kittanning Water Company.

The Butler Water Company was incorporated on November 2, 1877. On October 15, 1941, it acquired the assets and franchises of the Butler Suburban Water Company, and it acquired East Butler Water Company on January 10, 1949. The Citizens Water Company of Washington, Pa. was incorporated on January 7, 1886. On May 27, 1901, it acquired all of the assets and franchises of North Washington Water Company, East Washington Water Company, South Washington Water Company and West Washington Water Company. On March 17, 1927, it acquired North Strabane Water Company, which had previously acquired all of the assets and franchises of Cecil Water Company, Chartiers Township Water Company, Peoples Water Company of Canonsburg and South Canonsburg Water Company. The company later acquired the following systems: Jessop Water Company and Kalorama Water Company, June 8, 1928; Peters Township Water Company, September 17, 1954; Cowden Water Company and Pleasant View Water Company, May 27, 1955; Palanka Water Company, June 5, 1956; South Strabane Water Company, October 29, 1959; Mon Road Water Association, January 20, 1960; the "paper company" known as Citizens-South Franklin Township Water Company, November 20, 1968; and Hendersonville Water Company, December 31, 1969.

Clarion Water Company was incorporated on March 3, 1887. It acquired all of the assets and franchises of two "paper companies," namely, Clarion Township Water Company and Monroe Township Water Company on June 3, 1969.

Clymer Water Service Company was incorporated on April 26, 1886. On September 11, 1899, it acquired Clymer Water Company of West Indiana, and on April 22, 1966, it acquired all of the assets and franchises of a "paper company" known as Clymer White Township Water Company.

The Connellsville Water Company was incorporated on March 19, 1883. On August 8, 1892, it acquired the New Haven Water Company, and on September 30, 1897, it acquired Yough Water Company.

Ellwood Consolidated Water Company was incorporated on March 12, 1926. On April 13 of that year it acquired all of the assets and franchises of Ellwood Water Company,

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North Sewickley-Ellwood Water Company and Perry Ellwood Water Company. On December 2 of the same year, it acquired Franklin-Ellwood Water Company.

The Monongahela City Water Company was incorporated on July 8, 1886. On August 14, 1928, it acquired Domestic Water Company.

Monongahela Valley Water Corporation was incorporated on October 25, 1897. On July 6, 1898, it acquired all of the assets and franchises of Elizabeth Water Company, Lincoln Water Company and Jefferson and Mifflin Water Company. On December 15, 1949, it merged with The Monongahela Valley Water Company, which had previously acquired all of the assets and franchises of Clairton Water Company, Dravosburg Water Company, Elizabeth Township Water Company, Forward Township Water Company, Glassport Water Company, Jefferson Township Water Company, Lincoln Township Water Company, Mifflin Township Water Company and West Elizabeth Water Company. On March 8, 1968, the company acquired the water distribution systems of the Borough of Jefferson and the Borough of Pleasant Hills, and on July 28, 1969, it acquired the water distribution system of the Elizabeth Township Authority.

New Castle Water Company was incorporated on March 8, 1881. On August 15, 1902, it merged with The Mahoningtown Water Company, The West New Castle Water Company and The Shenango Water Company. On July 24, 1940, it acquired all of the assets and franchises of Neshannock Township Water Company, Shenango Township Water Company, South New Castle Water Company, Taylor Township Water Company, Hickory Township Water Company and Union Township Water Company.

Punxsutawney Water Service Company was incorporated on January 30, 1920, by virtue of the consolidation and merger between New Lindsey Water Company and New Punxsutawney Water Company.

Spring Water Company of Kane was incorporated on July 5, 1887.

Uniontown Water Company was incorporated on December 29, 1938, by virtue of a merger between The Uniontown Water Company and the South West Water Company.

The Warren Water Company was incorporated on June 27, 1881. On November 15, 1967, it acquired all of the assets and franchises of three "paper companies," namely, Warren Conewango Township Water Company, Warren Glade Township Water Company and Warren Pleasant Township Water Company.

West Penn Water Company was incorporated on December 30, 1924, by virtue of the merger between the Citizens Water Company of McDonald, Pa., Citizens Water Company of

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Cecil Township, Citizens Water Company of Robinson Township, Citizens Water Company of Mt. Pleasant Township, Citizens Water Company of North Fayette Township, Citizens Water Company of South Fayette Township and Citizens Water Company of Smith Township. On October 15, 1925, it acquired Midway Borough Water Company and Burgettstown Borough Water Company. On December 20, 1960, it acquired the Sturgeon Distribution System located in the Townships of North Fayette and South Fayette.

Westland Water Company was incorporated on April 9, 1946.

The former Mount Jewett Water Company was sold to the Mount Jewett Borough Authority in 1980.

WPW purchased seven water distribution systems from 1973 until the time of its merger with the former Pennsylvania-American Water Company: West Mifflin Borough system (Allegheny County), acquired September 25, 1973; Borough of West Homestead system (Allegheny County), acquired December 14, 1976; Lincoln Borough Water Authority system (Allegheny County), acquired December 1, 1980; Liberty Borough system (Allegheny County), acquired December 31, 1981; Anita Area Water Association system (Jefferson County), acquired September 19, 1985; Munhall Borough system (Allegheny County), acquired May 4, 1987; and Homestead Borough system (Allegheny County), October 26, 1987. On February 1, 1988, the franchises and property, real, personal and mixed, of Dedham Water Company were transferred to WPW, and Dedham was merged with and into WPW.

Before the 1989 merger, WPW provided service through 15 district offices (Butler, Clarion, Connellsville, Ellwood, Indiana, Kane, Kittanning, McDonald, Mon Valley, New Castle, Pittsburgh, Punxsutawney, Uniontown, Warren and Washington) to portions of 12 western Pennsylvania counties: Allegheny, Armstrong, Beaver, Butler, Clarion, Fayette, Indiana, Jefferson, Lawrence, McKean, Warren and Washington.

### (Former) Pennsylvania-American Water Company

After the merger of Riverton and Keystone in 1987, the former Pennsylvania-American Water Company purchased five systems: Red Land Water Company (incorporated December 27, 1955 to serve a portion of Fairview Township, York County), acquired June 30, 1987; Campbelltown Water Company (incorporated December 5, 1922 to serve the village of Campbelltown, Lebanon County), acquired January 25, 1988; Woodland-Bigler Area Authority system (established in 1961 to serve portions of Boggs and Bradford Townships, Clearfield County), acquired February 18, 1988; Allport Water Authority system (established October 14, 1958 to serve a portion of Morris Township, Clearfield County), acquired March 8, 1988; and

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Graham Water Association system (established to serve Graham Township and a portion of Morris Township, Clearfield County), acquired March 21, 1988.

### (Present) Pennsylvania-American Water Company

On March 24, 2003, Salisbury Water Supply Company (State of Massachusetts) was acquired and merged into the Company.
