The Commission should order that Duquesne Light not be allowed to install such digital smart meter, which emits radio frequency (RF) twenty-four hours a day. The Commission should order that the Complainant shall receive a medical exemption from Duquesne Light Company and be allowed to keep her long-lived current glass analog smart meter which contains an ERT [Tr. at 327, line 3] that emits RF at a maximum of "one time a day" or possibly "every 15 minutes" [Tr. at 163, line 1; Tr. at 328, line 13].

Such a medical exemption order would violate no Commission order, regulation, Commission-approved tariff, statute, or any aspect of the PUC Code or Act 129 of 2008. In fact, it would be in compliance with those and at the same time save ratepayer monies and help shield Duquesne Light Company and the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission from future liability claims.
