- (c) Reason for interruption or outage, including weather data where applicable: PECO Service territory was hit with tropical storm Isaias which had storm gusts ranging from 50-75 mph throughout the service territory. Two Tornadoes were confirmed in the service territory, one touched down in Philadelphia County (EF2) and continued northwest to Doylestown, Bucks County and one in Montgomery County (EF0).

**Forecast issued on MONDAY, AUGUST 3, 2020 TIME: 12:55**

Mostly dry this morning with scattered showers and storms pushing east-northeast into the afternoon and evening. A few severe thunderstorms will be possible, with damaging winds, hail, and frequent lightning likely. Rainy conditions will continue through the night as Isaias gradually tracks into the area.

**Forecast issued on TUESDAY, AUGUST 4, 2020 TIME: 12:55**

Isaias is quickly moving northward through the Mid-Atlantic this afternoon. Strong winds, heavy rainfall, and tornadoes will remain possible for a few hours. Conditions are then expected to continue to improve from south to north through the afternoon and evening.
