6. Applicant failed to attach information to its application that would indicate how Applicant intends to comply with the Commission's driver and vehicle safety regulations and service standards in Chapter 29 (relating to motor carriers of passengers), thus Protestant believes and therefore avers that Applicant does not possess the requisite technical fitness to provide the proposed service.

7. Applicant failed to attach information to its application that would indicate how Applicant intends to secure sufficient and continuous insurance coverage for all vehicles to be used or useful in the provision of service to the public, thus Protestant believes and therefore avers that Applicant does not possess the requisite technical fitness to provide the proposed service.

8. Applicant has submitted no evidence indicating that Applicant can meet the criteria in 52 Pa. Code § 41.14, thus approval of the Application is not necessary or proper for the service, accommodation, convenience, or safety of the public and would be contrary to public interest.

9. Protestant is unaware of any restrictive amendment that would adequately protect Protestant's interest to the point where they will withdraw their Protest. However, Protestant is open and willing to negotiate such an agreement.



**DOCUMENT
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BY THE COMMISSION:

This matter comes before the Commission on an application filed October 29, 2001. Public notice of the application was given in the Pennsylvania Bulletin of November 17, 2001. No protests were filed.

The unopposed application is certified to the Commission for its decision without oral hearing. The record consists of verified statements entered by the applicant and forty (40) supporting statements.

DISCUSSION AND FINDINGS:

Capital City Cab Service, Inc. (Capital or applicant) is domiciled at 362 South Front Street, Steelton, Dauphin County. Vehicles are stored, dispatched and repaired at this facility. The facility consists of a two bay garage, a dispatch office, the

owner's office and a waiting room. Capital has six telephone lines running into the dispatch office and has radio telephones established in each taxicab vehicle.

Capital currently provides call or demand service in Dauphin County, pursuant to authority granted October 27, 1997. As a currently certificated carrier, there is a presumption of fitness.

Forty (40) statements from individuals and businesses in the proposed service area have been entered in support of the application. The statements support the need for call or demand service in the counties of Cumberland, Perry and York.

After complete review of the record, we find:

1. The applicant has the equipment, experience and financial fitness to provide the proposed service.
2. Approval of the unopposed application, is necessary for the accommodation and convenience of the public; **THEREFORE,**

IT IS ORDERED: That the unopposed application, be and is hereby approved so that the certificate issued October 27, 1997, shall be amended to include the following right:

To transport, as a common carrier, persons upon call or demand, in the counties of Cumberland, Perry and York.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the applicant shall not engage in any transportation authorized by this order until the following is submitted to the Commission:


1. A tariff establishing just and reasonable rates.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That upon compliance with the requirements herein before set forth, a certificate shall issue evidencing the Commission's approval of the right to operate as above determined.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the authority granted herein to the extent that it duplicates authority now held by or subsequently granted to the applicant, shall not be construed as conferring more than one operating right.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That in the event said applicant has not, on or before sixty (60) days from the date of the service of this order, complied with the requirements hereinbefore set forth, the application shall be dismissed without further proceedings.

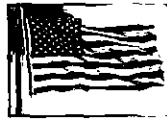

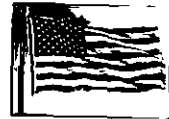
