Dear Secretary of the Commission:

Here I request your consideration in the judgment regarding the case:

Lori and Myung Bae v Metropolitan Edison Company

We do not possess the financial wherewithal to engage an attorney who can prepare 300-400 page volume of document on our behalf. But our case is simple and personal one as most would agree that cases differ on individual basis. After all, Electrosensitivity is a well documented phenomena in parts of the world where individuals exhibit acute sensitivity to overexposure to EMF. Others may show subtler symptoms that accrete over time nonetheless affect their quality of life.

In my particular case, I fear it will adversely affect the general anxiety disorder and depression which I struggle to manage each day. I choose not to take medications as I am chemically sensitive and do not tolerate most medications well. I can attest to my own electrosensitivity from personal accounts over the years that compelled me to avoid certain products such as tablets and devices that require prolonged exposure of the hands in its operation. It causes uncomfortable and tingling sensation that take a few days to resolve after avoiding the product. And I always choose to hard wire my PCs as well as use separate USB wired keyboards when writing on laptops. I have long ago cancelled the satellite TV after realizing it was exacerbating my chronic insomnia and general malaise and chronic fatigue. And soon after, I also learned the wifi was causing similar issues but more obvious evidence was seen in my cats that started exhibiting asthma symptoms which subsided after hardwiring the internet,

then only to realize that my own symptoms had improved. Presently I spend only a limited time on internet, I do use a simple go-phone for emergency purposes only.

Again, not having the same resources as the powerful institution such as Met Ed to consult an attorney, I plead as an individual from a personal standpoint. I do understand the convenience and accessibility and financial efficacy of Met Ed's proposal of Smart Meter for all. But one size fits all approach has its own downfall; it disenfranchises a portion of its more vulnerable consumers, though a minority they may be. I am more than willing to pay extra service charge to compensate for the cost of dispatching for the meter reading as some states such as NY have implemented to accommodate their consumers. I can also contact Met Ed with my own meter reading which is another option as I am more than happy to oblige.

I plead again for your leniency on behalf of consumers with special concerns. I thank you for your consideration.
