PREHEARING MEMORANDUM OF THE COALITION FOR AFFORDABLE UTILITY SERVICES AND ENERGY EFFICIENCY IN PENNSYLVANIA

On October 29, 2020, a Prehearing Conference Order was issued by Deputy Chief Administrative Law Judge Christopher P. Pell setting a telephonic prehearing conference for Monday, November 9, 2020 at 10 a.m., and requiring parties to file a Prehearing Memorandum no later than 12:00 pm on Thursday, November 5, 2020. In response, the Coalition for Affordable Utility Services and Energy Efficiency in Pennsylvania ("CAUSE-PA"), through its counsel at the Pennsylvania Utility Law Project, hereby files this Prehearing Conference Memorandum.

I. Background

On September 30, 2020, PECO Energy Company filed a request for a general rate increase for its gas operations, proposed Tariff Gas – Pa. PUC No. 4, which proposes to increase rates by approximately \$68.7 million per year. The bill for a typical residential gas customer with an average usage of 80 Ccf of gas per year would increase \$7.12 per month from \$78.85 to \$85.97, or 9.03%.

On October 22, 2020, CAUSE-PA filed a Petition to Intervene, requesting full intervenor status as an active party to the proceeding.

On October 29, 2020, the Commission entered a Suspension and Investigation Order suspending PECO's proposed tariff by operation of law, and opening an investigation to determine the lawfulness, justness, and reasonableness of the rates, rules, and regulations contained there in. (S&I Order).

II. Issues to be Presented

In addition to compliance with sound rate making principles, including the requirement that rates be just and reasonable, PECO must also ensure that its rates and tariff comply with universal service requirements. See 66 Pa. C.S. § 2203(8). In determining whether rates are just and reasonable, the Commission must examine whether rates are affordable and accessible those served.

In the event that the Commission approves any natural gas distribution rate increase, the Commission should condition approval on PECO's agreement to perform such actions as are necessary to assure compliance with applicable sections of the Public Utility Code, Commission regulations and guidelines, and settlement agreements.

CAUSE-PA has conducted an initial review of PECO's proposed tariff changes and testimony, and preliminarily opposes PECO's request on the grounds that the proposed rate increase and tariff changes may result in unjust and unreasonable rates that would impose severe hardship on low and moderate income residential customers. CAUSE-PA identifies the following specific issues of concern which it intends to address in this proceeding, though it

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reserves the right to raise additional issues which may arise through the course of this proceeding:

- i. The conformity to law and the effect of PECO's rate filing and proposed rate increase on low income households.
- The effect of PECO's proposed fixed residential customer charge on low income households, and the ability to achieve appreciable bill savings through adoption of energy efficiency measures.
- iii. The effect of PECO's rate filing and proposed rate increase on low income households enrolled in or eligible for PECO's Universal Service Programs, and the adequacy of those programs in delivering universally accessible natural gas service.

III. <u>Witnesses and Testimony</u>
