



SECTION 1
RULES & REGULATIONS

ITEM 20 - GOVERNING PUBLICATIONS

For rates, rules, regulations, and provisions applicable to the transportation of household goods, in use, except as otherwise provided herein, see Tariff Freight P.A. P. U. C. No. 53 (Carrier Directory), loose-leaf revisions thereto and successive issues thereof, issued by Tristate Household Goods Tariff Conference, Inc., Agent.

ITEM 30 - CLASSIFICATION OF PROPERTY

Class 1 shipments are personal effects and property used or to be used in a dwelling when a part of the equipment or supply of such dwelling and such other similar property; except that this subparagraph shall not be construed to include property moving from a factory or store, except such property as the householder has purchased with the intent to use in his dwelling and which is transported at the request of, and the transportation charges paid to the carrier by the householder.

ITEM 40 - DECLARED VALUE

Rates and charges named herein are applicable when value declared by shipper does not exceed sixty (60) cents per pound, per article. For method of determining rates when value declared exceeds sixty (60) cents per pound, per article, see Replacement Cost Protection on Page 6 of this tariff.

HOURLY RATES

Subject to Notes 1 to 6 below, the transportation charges on any shipment shall be a COMBINATION of the applicable TRAVELING CHARGE named in Column 1 plus HOURLY CHARGE at applicable rates named in Columns 2, 3 and 4.

Hourly rates apply from the time of arrival at the first point of origin and continue during all loading, transportation from first point of origin, as well as any extra stops, to the final destination & unloading and dismissal of vehicle and men by shipper at the final destination.

Traveling charges include charges for providing truck(s) for the job and covers traveling from mover's base facility to first point of origin and returning from the final destination to the mover's base facility. Travel charge will be equal to the hourly rate based on number of men shown below.

NOTE 1 Traveling charges (Column 1) are in addition to hourly rates (Columns 2, 3, and 4).

NOTE 2 Hourly rates (Columns 2, 3, and 4) are based on the day or days, or period of days, as indicated, during which services are performed.

NOTE 3 Hourly rates (Columns 2, 3, and 4) computed in quarter-hour periods; fractions of one-quarter hour will be considered as one-quarter hour.

▲ NOTE 4 When requested by customer to hold shipment overnight, additional cost will be \$100.00 per truck per night.

NOTE 5 Minimum total transportation charges: Sundays and Holidays (any hour): three (3) hours at rates named in Columns 1 and 2. Weekdays, 7:00AM to 5:00PM: two (2) hours at rates named in Columns 1 and 3. Weekdays, 5:01PM to 6:59AM, and Saturdays (any hour): two (2) hours at rates named in Columns 1 and 4.

NOTE 6 Any additional costs associated with the move, such as, parking fees or tolls will be added to the customer's invoice.

FUEL COST RECOVERY SURCHARGE

LOCAL MOVES (40 miles & under from origin to destination)

The following Fuel Cost Recovery Surcharge will apply as follows on shipments of household goods in use, between points in Pennsylvania, transported distances of forty (40) miles and less.

- (a) The Fuel Cost Recovery Surcharge will be calculated using a "BASE PRICE PER GALLON" of \$1.267.
- (b) On the first Monday of each calendar month, the "CENTRAL ATLANTIC" average price per gallon of diesel fuel will be determined based on the price stated by the U. S. Department of Energy (DOE), Energy Information Administration (EIA) survey of "Retail-On-Highway Diesel Prices." This price will be obtained by calling the DOE Fuel Hot Line at 202-586-6966 or via the DOE Internet Website at www.eia.doe.gov.
- (c) If the first Monday of the calendar month is a federal holiday, the price will be determined based on the stated DOE price available on the next subsequent business day (Tuesday).
- (d) The DOE fuel price obtained will then become effective on the fifteenth (15th) day of the same month. The adjustment determined will apply for shipments loaded beginning on the 15th day of the month and remain in effect through the 14th day of the subsequent following month starting from the effective date of this item.

THIS PROCESS WILL CONTINUE MONTH AFTER MONTH BASED ON THE "NEW" MONTHLY FUEL COSTS.

OR EXAMPLE

If the reported price of self-service diesel fuel determined on Monday, 10/01/2018, is \$3.447 per gallon, that amount will apply for the purpose of calculating the difference between that amount and the base price of \$1.267 per gallon for shipments loaded as of October 15, 2018 to November 14, 2018.

TO DETERMINE THE FUEL ADJUSTMENT AMOUNT TO APPLY, FIRST DETERMINE THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE "BASE PRICE PER GALLON" AND THE MOST CURRENT SELF-SERVICE DIESEL FUEL PRICE PER GALLON.

▲ FULL-VALUE PROTECTION

Full-Value Protection Coverage, if requested by customer, is \$6.00 per \$1,000.00 of declared value of the customer's belongings with a minimum declared value of \$10,000.00 (customer pays minimum of \$60.00) and a \$150.00 deductible applies no matter what level of coverage the customer has selected. Maximum value per truck load is \$50,000.00. Below is a chart breaking down how the protection is handled.
