RESPONDENT'S STATUS REPORT

Respondent Duquesne Light Company (“Duquesne Light” or the “Company”) files this Status Report pursuant to the Presiding Administrative Law Judge’s Interim Order dated April 8, 2021:

1. Electric service for 515 Kelly Avenue, Pittsburgh, PA 15221 (the “Property”) is currently on and active in the name of Todd Koger, Sr. (“Complainant”).
2. On or about November 27, 2020, Complainant filed a Chapter 7 bankruptcy petition in the Bankruptcy Court for the Western District of Pennsylvania, at docket number 20-23340-TPA.
3. At the time the Complainant filed for bankruptcy, Complainant’s account balance was \$2,018.61 (“Pre-Petition Arrearage”).
4. On or about March 10, 2021, the Complainant’s bankruptcy petition was discharged.
5. As a result, the Company was required to write-off the customer’s Pre-Petition Arrearage as an unsecured creditor.

6. Accordingly, all of the balance owed prior to the bankruptcy petition was removed from collections.

7. Complainant's post-petition balance is \$280.03, which represents the electric charges that have accrued since the filing of the bankruptcy petition.

8. On or about April 7, 2020, the Company received a pledge for a \$196.56 cash grant from the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (also known as "LIHEAP").

9. Given the foregoing, Complainant is not currently in threat of termination.

10. The Company has not been able to discuss the above-captioned matter with the Complainant since the telephonic hearing on February 25, 2020.

11. Attempts to contact the Complainant by telephone and by mail have been unsuccessful.

12. The most recent attempts to contact the Complainant in relation to the above-captioned consolidated matter was by letter dated February 12, 2021 and by telephone on April 7, 2021.
