AND NOW, this 17th day of June 2020, the Delaware Public Service Commission (“Commission”) determines and orders the following:

WHEREAS, on February 5, 2020, Tenaska Power Management, LLC (the “Company” or “TPS”) submitted to the Commission an application for an Electric Supplier Certificate (“ESC”) to provide and broker electricity in the State of Delaware pursuant 26 *Del. C.* §§ 1001-1020, the Electric Utility Restructuring Act (the “Act”),¹ and 26 *Del. Admin. C.* § 3001, the Commission’s Rules for Certification and Regulation of Electric Suppliers (the “Supplier Rules”); and

WHEREAS, the application was deficient in meeting the minimum filing requirements (“MFRs”); therefore, Commission Staff (“Staff”) sent the Company two letters and engaged in information gathering over the course of three months; and

WHEREAS, on May 8, 2020, the Company submitted all required documents and thereby filed a complete application (“Application”) pursuant to the Act and the Supplier Rules; and

WHEREAS, as more specifically detailed in its Memorandum to the Commission, Staff reports that the Application fulfills all the requirements set forth in the Act and the Supplier Rules for an Electric Supplier Certificate to act as both an electric supplier and an electric broker. In

particular, Staff reports that the Company has specifically presented evidence to support its financial, operational, managerial, and technical ability to provide and broker Electric Supply Service within the State of Delaware. Therefore, Staff recommends that the Commission issue an Electric Supplier Certificate to authorize Tenaska Power Management, LLC to provide and broker Electric Supply Services in the State of Delaware;

**NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED BY THE AFFIRMATIVE VOTE
OF NOT FEWER THAN THREE COMMISSIONERS:**

1. TPS is hereby granted a certificate to do business and operate as an Electric Supplier within the State of Delaware. Under this Electric Supplier Certificate, the Company is authorized to broker Electric Supply Service within the State of Delaware consistent with and in accordance with the Act and the Supplier Rules.

2. TPS is hereby notified that a violation of any applicable order, statute, regulation, rule, or other controlling authority may be enforced by sanctions in accordance with §§ 1012(a) and 1019 of the Act and § 3001-10.2 of the Supplier Rules.

3. TPS shall file such reports and pay such fees and assessments as may be required or imposed under §§ 114, 115, § 1012(c)(2) of the Act, and §§ 3001-3.9 and 3.10 of the Supplier Rules.

4. TPS consents to the jurisdiction of the courts of the State of Delaware for all acts or omissions related to its offering of Electric Supply Services in Delaware.

5. TPS is hereby placed on notice that the costs of this proceeding will be charged to it pursuant to 26 *Del. C.* § 114(b)(1).

6. The Commission reserves the jurisdiction and authority to enter such further orders in this matter as may be deemed necessary or proper.

I. INTRODUCTION

1. By this Order, the Public Service Commission of the District of Columbia (“Commission”) grants a license to Tenaska Power Management, LLC (“TPM” or “Applicant”) to function as an electricity supplier in the District of Columbia.¹ Tenaska Power Management, LLC’s license is effective upon issuance of this Order.

II. BACKGROUND

2. On March 17, 2021, TPM filed its license application.² Specifically, TPM intends to operate as a broker of electricity pursuant to § 4601 in Chapter 46 (Electricity Suppliers) of Title 15 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations.³ The Applicant represents that it intends to serve commercial and industrial customers in the District of Columbia. TPM filed supplemental information on April 1, 2021.⁴

III. DISCUSSION

3. Our review of the information contained in TPM’s application and supplemental filing demonstrates that it has met all the prescribed licensing requirements and that the Applicant has the ability and the financial integrity to serve electricity customers in the District of Columbia. The Commission also finds that granting TPM’s

application will serve the public interest by fostering competition in the District's energy market. Accordingly, TPM's application is approved.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

4. The application of Tenaska Power Management, LLC for a license to conduct business in the District of Columbia as an electricity supplier is hereby **GRANTED**. Tenaska Power Management, LLC's license is effective upon issuance of this Order.

ORDER

By the Commission:

I. INTRODUCTION

On November 26, 2019, Tenaska Power Management, LLC (“Applicant”) filed a verified Application with the Illinois Commerce Commission (“Commission”) requesting a certificate of service authority to operate as an agent, broker, or consultant (“ABC”) in Illinois pursuant to Section 16-115C of the Public Utilities Act (“Act”), 220 ILCS 5/1-101 et seq., and 83 Ill. Adm. Code 454, "Licensure of Retail Electric Agents, Brokers and Consultants" (“Part 454”). Applicant requests authority to offer services as an ABC for the procurement or sale of retail electricity supply for third parties in the State of Illinois. Since all of the information to grant the requested relief was contained in the Application, the Hearing was waived.

II. REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL APPLICANTS UNDER SECTION 16-115C OF THE ACT

Applicant is a business organized under the laws of Delaware and authorized to transact business in Illinois. Applicant has certified that it will comply with all applicable regulations; that it will comply with informational and reporting requirements established by Commission rule; that it will comply with informational and reporting requirements pursuant to Section 16-115C of the Act; and that it will comply with all other applicable laws, regulations, terms, and conditions required to the extent they have application to the services being offered by an ABC. Applicant has agreed to ensure that any person who acts on its behalf will comply with all applicable sections of Part 454. Applicant agrees that it will remain in compliance with the provisions of the Act and Part 454, and will ensure that authorizations received from customers, and all other applicable records are retained for a period of not less than three calendar years after the calendar year in which they were created. Applicant has agreed to adopt and follow rules and procedures to preserve the confidentiality of its customers’ data. The Applicant has also attested that no complaints have been filed against it for its provision of services in the electric or gas industry in the jurisdictions where it provides or is seeking to provide services.

III. FINANCIAL, TECHNICAL, AND MANAGERIAL REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 16-115C

Applicant is required by Section 454.60 to demonstrate that it meets the managerial qualifications necessary to provide services as an ABC. Applicant must further provide an organizational chart that indicates the position of persons which satisfy the managerial qualification. Applicant has demonstrated that it meets the managerial qualifications set forth in Section 454.60 through Attachment II to the Application. Attachment II and III to the Application contains a corporate organizational chart and identifies the occupational background information of the persons being used to meet the requirements of Section 454.60(a). Attachment II contains occupational background information on the person or persons being used to meet the requirements of Section 454.60(a).

Applicant is required by Section 454.70 to demonstrate that it meets the technical qualifications necessary to provide services as an ABC. Applicant has demonstrated that it meets the technical qualifications set forth in Section 454.70 with the information provided in Attachment III. Attachment III contains occupational background information on the person or persons being used to meet the requirements of Section 454.70(a).

Pursuant to the requirements of Section 454.80 of Part 454, Applicant provided a surety bond in the amount of \$5,000 issued by a qualifying surety authorized to transact business in Illinois. Applicant further agrees to comply with the Code of Conduct for ABCs contained in Section 454.90.

IV. COMMISSION CONCLUSION AND CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE AUTHORITY

The Commission has reviewed the Application and attachments provided by Applicant regarding the technical, managerial, and financial requirements and all other requirements of the Act and Part 454 and finds that the Applicant sufficiently demonstrates compliance with the requirements. The Commission concludes, therefore, that Applicant's request for a certificate of service authority to operate as an ABC in Illinois should be granted and should include the following authority:

CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE AUTHORITY

IT IS CERTIFIED that Tenaska Power Management, LLC is granted service authority to operate as an agent, broker, or consultant for the procurement or sale of retail electricity supply for third parties in the State of Illinois.

V. FINDINGS AND ORDERING PARAGRAPHS

The Commission, having reviewed the entire record, is of the opinion and finds that:

- (1) Tenaska Power Management, LLC, a business organized under the laws of Delaware and authorized to transact business in Illinois, seeks a certificate of service authority to operate as an ABC under Section 16-115C of the Act;

- (2) the Commission has jurisdiction over the party hereto and the subject matter hereof;
- (3) the recitals of fact and conclusions reached in the prefatory portion of this Order are supported by the record and are hereby adopted as findings of fact;
- (4) Tenaska Power Management, LLC has demonstrated that it possesses sufficient financial, managerial, and technical resources and abilities to provide services as an ABC for the procurement or sale of retail electricity supply to third parties in the State of Illinois;
- (5) Tenaska Power Management, LLC has complied with Section 16-115C of the Act and Part 454; and
- (6) Tenaska Power Management, LLC should be granted a certificate of service authority to operate as an ABC as specified in this Order.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Illinois Commerce Commission that Tenaska Power Management, LLC is hereby granted a Certificate of Service Authority authorizing it to operate as an agent, broker, or consultant; said Certificate of Service Authority shall read as that set forth in Section IV of this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Tenaska Power Management, LLC shall comply with all applicable Commission rules and orders now and as hereafter amended.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that pursuant to Section 10-113(a) of the Public Utilities Act and 83 Ill. Adm. Code 200.880, any application for rehearing shall be filed within 30 days after service of the Order on the party.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, subject to the provisions of Section 10-113 of the Public Utilities Act and 83 Ill. Adm. Code 200.880, this Order is final; it is not subject to the Administrative Review Law.





Applicant has contracted with an affiliate, Tenaska, Inc. (Tenaska), as an advisor and consultant, for general administrative services on an as needed basis. These services include, but are not limited to, Accounting, Contract Administration, Communications, Management Services, and Computer Support Services. Tenaska provides similar services to Tenaska Power Services Co. (TPS).

Applicant has also contracted with TPS for technical services related to accessing the wholesale power markets and managing information and data flows. TPS is a leading nationwide power marketing firm, engaged in the physical and financial trading of wholesale power throughout the United States and in Canada. It is certified to provide scheduling, settlement and market interface services in ERCOT, MISO, PJM, NYISO, SPP, CAISO and ISO-NE. TPS assists independent power producers, municipal and cooperative utilities, large industrial customers and competitive retailers in meeting load obligations and optimizing resource value by performing a broad range of power marketing services, including trading congestion revenue rights, Renewable Energy Certificates and emission allowances. TPS coordinates purchase and sale of electric capacity, energy and ancillary services, as well as energy risk management and financial and physical hedging, for its third-party clients, both renewable (wind, solar and landfill gas) and fossil fueled. TPS also offers scheduling, bidding and market interface and operations, including customized accounting, settlement, invoicing and reporting services and round-the-clock trading operations. TPS will provide Applicant with a round the clock market interface, and assist Applicant with acquisition of energy supplies, scheduling, hedging, meeting renewable portfolio requirements, and customer settlements.

The following key personnel will provide services in their designated areas of responsibility, will supervise personnel reporting to them in their respective areas to ensure provision of services, and will be responsible for managing the contract relationship with TPM and with TPS for their respective functions to coordinate the provision of services.

Curry Aldridge

Curry Aldridge is the Sr. Vice President of Origination and Commercial Operations for TPM, who is tasked with supervising TPM's day-to-day operations, and leading its entrance into the retail electric market space. He will be responsible for managing TPM's service contracts with Tenaska and TPS, and for managing the team of Tenaska and TPS professionals assigned to supporting TPM.

Curry joined Tenaska in February 2000. During his time at Tenaska, Curry worked on the 24-hour Real-time Trading/Scheduling desk for three years, where he was responsible for trading and scheduling activities in multiple markets. In February 2003, Curry began working in the Origination group focusing on the ERCOT market where he was responsible for signing long-term marketing and energy management structured transactions with both wholesale and retail third parties. During this time, Curry held the proxy vote for TPS on the Retail Market Subcommittee in 2003-2004 and served as the Independent Power Marketer segment member in 2005. He was also a NERC-certified System Operator from 2003-2008.

In 2007, Curry shifted his origination efforts to the PJM market where he started TPS's retail business in that market, as well as expanding the existing wholesale energy management business. In August 2008, he transitioned over and began managing TPS's energy management business. Responsibilities in this role involved the day-to-day management of scheduling, management and optimization activities for TPS's energy management customers in the ERCOT, MISO, PJM, SERC and SPP power markets. These

duties included directing the incorporation of new energy management customers into TPS's energy management programs and coordinating internally between Tenaska's Operations, Trading, Origination, Settlements, Accounting, Risk Management, and Information Technology groups. From 2010-2011, Curry served as TPS's representative on the ERCOT Wholesale Market Subcommittee as the Independent Power Marketer segment member. During this time in energy management, Curry also was responsible for managing TPS's ERCOT Nodal implementation efforts as well as managing TPS's EMS/SCADA operations.

In February, 2013, Curry became responsible for managing the day-to-day operations of the business. These duties include managing the settlements, accounting, credit, controls, process integrity, contracts, and strategic technology departments.

Curry holds a Bachelor of Business Administration degree in Marketing from Abilene Christian University in Abilene, Texas.

Eli Worley

As Director of Settlements and Customer Support for TPM since January 2019, Ms. Worley, based in Texas, is responsible for the day-to-day settlement activities in multiple power markets.
