

Catalyst Power & Gas, LLC ("Catalyst") is a newly formed competitive retail electricity and natural gas supplier. Catalyst is managed by experienced retail energy professionals with extensive experience in all aspects of retail energy operations, including wholesale energy supply management, risk management, renewable energy development, retail energy financing, regulatory compliance, customer acquisition and sales quality assurance, customer service.

Company History and Summary of Operations

Catalyst was formed in 2020, as a wholly owned subsidiary of Catalyst Power Holdings, LLC¹. Catalyst was granted Market Based Rate Authority by FERC by Order entered on December 14, 2020 at Docket No. ER20-2979-000.

Catalyst Power & Gas became a member of the ISO New England effective February 1, 2021. Catalyst is current licensed as an Electricity Supplier and Natural Gas Supplier by the Massachusetts Department of Public Utilities. (See attached MA DPU Orders entered on March 19, 2021 in Docket No. CS-191 and March 22, 2021 in Docket No. GS-073). Catalyst has also been registered as a Natural Gas Supplier with the Connecticut Public Utilities Regulatory Authority. Catalyst has submitted an application to the Connecticut Public Utilities Regulatory Authority seeking Licensure as an Electric Supplier, which Application is still pending

Catalyst currently has one affiliate operating as a retail energy provider in New York State, U.S. Energy Partners, LLC ("USEP"). USEP became an affiliate of Catalyst's when it was acquired by Catalyst Power Holdings LLC in February of 2021. USEP is an active member in good standing of the NYISO.

Catalyst's Chief Executive Officer is Gabe Phillips. Mr. Phillips is a 15-year energy industry veteran, starting his career trading electricity and gas at Sempra Energy Trading. From 2010-2019 he was the Managing Director of GP Energy Management, a multifaceted Energy Services Company that provides Consulting, Commodity Risk, Operations Management, and Project Development Support to retail energy suppliers. During his nine years leading GP Energy Management, Mr. Phillips provided wide-ranging ongoing consulting and operational services to dozens of retail energy suppliers, including regulatory licensing and compliance, new market entry, utility, pipeline and ISO registration/coordination, wholesale energy procurement and risk management, scheduling coordination, financing and preferred supplier transactions, mergers and acquisitions, product development, and renewable portfolio standards compliance.

At GP Energy Management, Mr. Phillips developed and managed a team of 25 industry experts and the proprietary systems responsible for the full-service management of electricity and gas demand, renewable and fossil generation across the US and Canada. Mr. Phillips'

company was also a proprietary investor in solar, gas-fired cogeneration, renewable energy merchant finance transactions, proprietary REC trading and physical/financial power/gas trading, and achieved returns on equity in excess of 50%.

Catalyst's Chief Operating Officer is Joel Glassman. Mr. Glassman is a 20 year retail energy industry veteran. In his role at Catalyst, Mr. Glassman will lead the retail commercial and industrial electricity and gas business through expansion into new utilities, commodities and states. He will also help to integrate community solar and distributed generation into the retail energy business.

Prior to joining Catalyst in March of 2021, Mr. Glassman was the Chief Operating Officer of Discount Power, Inc., where he led the successful expansion of the company into fifteen new markets. Mr. Glassman also has held positions in Power Operation, Corporate Development and FP&A at multiple retail energy companies.

Catalyst's Chief Financial Officer is Dara Phillips. Ms. Phillips spent 4 years in audit at PWC and then five years alongside Gabe managing all financial aspects of GP Energy Management as VP of Finance (including various subsidiaries, project companies and herself providing outsourced financial management services to over 10 different Energy Suppliers.) In addition to her time at PWC and GP Energy Management, Ms. Phillips has worked for 2 years in private equity fund accounting. She has managed the end-to-end finance needs for solar projects, cogeneration projects, proprietary power, gas and renewable energy credit trading and merchant finance operations and an energy management services platform including the acquisition of two term loans and revolving lines of credit. She presided over two successful exits and managed the diligence processes, modeling and workflow for each.

In her role at Catalyst Power, Ms. Phillips is responsible for all financial management of Catalyst Power and all platform and REP subsidiaries. She is responsible for FP&A, cash management, reporting and day-to-day HR administration.

Catalyst's Chief Technology Officer is Carlo Barbara. Carlo is a 16 year veteran technologist who, after studying CS and Math at Columbia University went on to roles as VP at Goldman Sachs, VP of Engineering at Rent The Runway and overseeing all software for a family of mutual funds at a premier asset manager. Today, as Catalyst Power's CTO, Carlo is bringing to bear his experience and expertise in leading the creation of technology to enable Catalyst Power to put the entire experience of buying commercial energy and distributed solar and gas generation online.

Catalyst's Vice President of Business Intelligence is Leah Ivanhoe. Leah has 10 years of energy sector experience including 6 years at Crius Energy where she served as a liaison, during and for six months, after its acquisition by Vistra Energy. In addition, during her tenure at Crius, Ms. Ivanhoe held many different roles across the organization including responsibility over pricing, gross margin forecasting, financial reporting, renewable portfolio obligations, companywide business intelligence and, most recently, the integration between Crius and Vistra Energy. Leah earned an M.B.A. with a concentration in finance from the University of Connecticut and a

B.S. in mathematics from Adelphi University. Today, as Catalyst Power's VP of Business Intelligence, Leah is responsible for retail energy company valuation, wholesale and retail energy intelligence and analytics, pricing model development and management, close coordination with the technology and finance teams and any area where data is used to make decisions here at Catalyst Power.

Resumes of Catalyst's key officers are attached to this Application.

Operational Plans

Catalyst intends to focus primarily on serving commercial and industrial customers, but eventually may also develop products for residential customers. Catalyst works with industry leading companies to provide its utility EDI and billing functions, and to provide support for energy and natural gas scheduling and forecasting functions. Both Mr. Phillips and Mr. Glassman have extensive experience with wholesale energy procurement and utility coordination issues, and will apply that experience to ensure Catalyst's operations run smoothly.

Catalyst Power will utilize several customer acquisition channels. The primary channel will be digital marketing. The other channels we expect to utilize to varying degrees are inhouse direct sales and external supply brokers. Digital marketing will include search engine optimization, unpaid or organic social media, paid search ads and paid social media ads in addition to targeted programs like direct email outreach to prospective customers.

All customer enrollments will be confirmed via bilateral, duly executed customer contracts. All documents will be executed either through docusign or wet signature by authorized representatives of both the customer and Catalyst. Catalyst will also ensure oversight of all sales, marketing and customer enrollment as more fully described in the Marketing Oversight summary attached to this Application.

Technical and Managerial Qualifications

Catalyst meets the appropriate technical qualifications necessary to successfully and properly do business as an Electricity Generation Supplier and Natural Gas Supplier. Catalyst has received Market Based Rate Authority from FERC. Catalyst has also already been approved for membership in ISO-New England and has received Electricity and Natural Gas Supplier licenses from the Massachusetts Department of Public Utilities. Catalyst is also registered as a Natural Gas Supplier in Connecticut, and its affiliate U.S. Energy Partners is a member of NYISO and a longstanding energy supplier in New York. Catalyst Energy is led by a team that has decades of experience in managing and advising retail suppliers, and has substantial expertise in all aspects of energy supplier operations, including finance, energy forecasting, procurement, pricing, customer acquisition, sales oversight, customer service, regulatory compliance, and utility coordination. Catalyst's CEO Gabriel Phillips is a 15 industry veteran who personally advised dozens of retail suppliers on energy procurement, risk management, and

renewable energy obligations and who supervised a team of 25 consultants who provided a full range of operational services to retail suppliers. Catalyst's COO Joel Glassman brings 20 years of experience operating a successful retail supplier. For all of these reasons, Catalyst respectfully submits that is meets the appropriate technical, financial and managerial qualifications for licensure as an Electricity Generation Supplier and Natural Gas Supplier in Pennsylvania.

Compliance with Sales, Marketing and Customer Service Regulations

Catalyst's leadership team has reviewed the applicable statute and regulations and has engaged local counsel and a well-known industry consultant, P.R. Quinlan, to provide regulatory guidance and support. Catalyst will ensure that all applicable statutes, regulations, rules, and Commission Orders are strictly followed and will implement policies to ensure that all sales marketing and customer service is done in full compliance with the law. Catalyst has a dedicated inhouse customer service department to manage new enrollments, cancellations, terminations, utility electronic data transfer and billing, and customer notices (including notices prior to the contract termination dates or renewal dates), and commission reporting obligations.

Catalyst Power & Gas, LLC will initially only be offering enrollment to commercial customers. Enrollments will be solicited primarily through digital/online means, via authorized energy supply brokers, and by direct outreach to prospective customers by in-house Catalyst personnel. In all cases, Catalyst will first obtain authorization from the prospective customer to review historical usage and load data, and will prepare a customized quote for the prospective customer. In all enrollments will be completed by means of duly executed bilateral contracts, signed both by authorized representatives of Catalyst and the customer. Such signatures will be obtained in ink on paper or via electronic means.

Catalyst has no intention to conduct any telemarketing or door to door marketing. All communications with prospective commercial customers will either be done digitally or by prescheduled appointment.

All internal agents communicating with customers regarding possible enrollment will be trained on the following subjects as required by 52 Pa. Code § 111:

- (1) State and Federal laws and regulations that govern marketing, telemarketing, consumer protection and door-to-door sales, including consumer protection regulations in Chapters 54 and 62 (relating to electricity generation customer choice; and natural gas supply customer choice), applicable provisions in Chapters 56, 57 and 59 (relating to standards and billing practices for residential utility service; electric service; and gas service) and the act.
 - (2) Responsible and ethical sales practices
 - (3) Catalyst's products and services.
 - (4) Catalyst's rates, rate structures and payment options.
 - (5) The customer's right to rescind and cancel contracts.
 - (6) The applicability of an early termination fee for contract cancellation
- (7) The necessity of adhering to the script and knowledge of the contents of the script if one is used.
 - (8) The proper completion of transaction documents.
 - (9) Catalyst's disclosure statement.
- (10) Terms and definitions related to energy supply, transmission and distribution service as found in the dictionary of utility terms
- (11) Information about how customers may contact Catalyst to obtain information about billing, disputes and complaints.
- (12) The confidentiality and protection of customer information and § § 54.43(d) and 62.114 (relating to standards of conduct and disclosure for licensees).

To the extent that Catalyst eventually uses any outside sales vendors for sales to residential or small commercial customers, Catalyst will thoroughly vet all prospective vendors and require multiple trade references to ensure that only reputable, experienced vendors market on behalf of Catalyst. Any sales vendor hired will be required to confirm its ability to comply with the Pennsylvania-specific agent training and oversight requirements outlined above. All vendors will be monitored by Catalyst's Chief Operating Officer for sales compliance, and Catalyst will develop a quality assurance monitoring program to contact a significant sample of all new mass market customers. Vendors who demonstrate an inability to adhere to Catalyst's standards and/or the Commission's regulations will be immediately terminated.

For any contracts with residential or small commercial customers based on sales performed by an agent, Catalyst will also utilize a separate digital or telephonic verification process as required by 52 Pa. Code 111.7.

For the broker channel for its commercial customer enrollments, Catalyst will only accept enrollment referrals from licensed brokers who strictly adhere to Catalyst's operational and marketing standards.

Catalyst Power is licensed by the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission to offer and supply natural gas supply in Pennsylvania. Our PUC license number for natural gas supply is _____.

Your natural gas supply prices will be set by Catalyst Power. The Public Utility Commission regulates natural gas distribution prices and services.

You will continue to receive your bill from your Natural Gas Distribution Company (NGDC) for all natural gas supply and delivery charges. Your NGDC will continue to provide all emergency repairs and services. Catalyst Power is not affiliated with and does not represent your NGDC.

Definitions: Commodity Charges - The charges for the natural gas product which is sold either in cubic feet or dekatherms.

- I. Agreement to Sell and Purchase Energy. Subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, Catalyst Power agrees to sell and deliver, and Customer agrees to purchase and accept the quantity of natural gas, as estimated by Catalyst Power necessary to meet Customer's requirements based upon consumption data obtained by Catalyst Power or the delivery schedule of the NGDC. Catalyst Power is not affiliated with and does not represent the NGDC. The amount of natural gas supplied under this Agreement is subject to change based upon data reflecting Customer's consumption obtained by Catalyst Power or the NGDC's delivery schedule. Your price includes natural gas commodity charges and estimated total state taxes, but excludes Pennsylvania sales tax, if applicable. If Customer terminates prior to the end of the Initial Term, an ETF of \$10 for each month remaining in the Initial Term will be charged. For residential customers, the ETF will be no greater than \$100 if the remaining term is less than 12 months, and \$200 if the remaining term is more than 12 months. The NGDC will separately bill for, and Customer will be obligated to pay, all NGDC delivery related rates and charges. Customer will receive a single bill for both natural gas supply and delivery costs from NGDC. Catalyst Power may assign and sell Customer accounts receivable to the NGDC. Failure by a customer to make full payment of Catalyst Power charges due on any consolidated bill prepared by the NGDC for Catalyst Power will be grounds for disconnection of utility services in accordance with PA PUC rules and regulations on the termination of service to residential customers. Your NGDC may request a security deposit for amounts which include supplier charges. Your NGDC maintains the right to terminate service for any unpaid utility or supplier charges, pursuant to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission's regulations.

- 5. Assignment. Customer may not assign its interests in and delegate its obligations under this Agreement without the express written consent of Catalyst Power. This information may be used by Catalyst Power to determine whether it will commence

and/or continue to provide energy supply service to Customer and will not be disclosed to a third party unless required by law. Catalyst Power will maintain the confidentiality of the customer's personal information including name, address, phone number, usage, and payment history as required by applicable PUC regulations and Federal and State law. Catalyst Power will not release the customer's private confidential information to a third party without the customer's express consent. This authorization will remain in effect during the Initial Term and any Renewal Term. Customer may rescind this authorization at any time by providing written notice thereof to Catalyst Power or by calling Catalyst Power at 1-888-789-7250. Catalyst Power reserves the right to cancel this Agreement in the event Customer rescinds the authorization.

- Cancellation. A residential customer may cancel this Agreement at any time by contacting Catalyst Power at 1-888-789-7250 or by email at customercare@catalystpower.com. If you cancel this agreement you will owe us for amounts unpaid up to the date of cancellation. Catalyst Power may cancel this agreement at any time upon providing written notice to Customer. Common reasons for Catalyst Power to cancel this agreement would include: Non-Payment If your natural gas service is terminated by your NGDC, then this agreement is cancelled on the date that your natural gas service is terminated. You will owe us for amounts unpaid for our charges for natural gas supply service up to the date of termination. Customer Move If the customer moves from the address listed above, this agreement is cancelled. If we cancel this agreement for any reason other than for customer non-payment, we will follow applicable rules in providing notice to you.
- 8. Final Bill. Customer acknowledges that in the event of a cancellation or termination of this Agreement it may take several billing cycles for Customer to return to the NGDC or another supplier for supply service. Customer is liable for all Catalyst Power charges until Customer returns to the NGDC or goes to another supplier. 
