I urge you to support the proposed settlement between ETC Northeast Pipeline and the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission. ETC has promised this issue surrounding Revolution pipeline has been fully resolved, and is taking the necessary steps to uphold that promise.

Energy Transfer has taken responsibility for addressing the concerns. In fact, ETC has already taken action, closely inspecting the Revolution pipeline entirely after it was rerouted. The health and wellbeing of the community, environment, and workforce is of utmost importance to the members of our Chamber of Commerce, and it appears to be as well for ETC, as it has stated it will fully uphold safety requirements each step of the way. For these reasons, I feel the settlement is appropriate.

The Revolution pipeline brings immense benefits to our region, safely delivering natural gas throughout Pennsylvania, specifically through Allegheny, Beaver, Butler, and Washington counties. Communities across our state rely on projects such as this one to provide good-paying jobs and reliable energy – without it, residents and businesses are forced to find other alternatives. If available, those alternative means of transporting or sourcing natural gas are most often NOT in the best interest of the community, environment or workforce, either through introduction of additional risk or being uncompetitive in cost structure.

At the Beaver County Chamber of Commerce, we value innovation and collaboration. To us, innovation means, “applying creative solutions to challenges,” while collaboration establishes “effective partnerships.” We see the proposed settlement as being in alignment with those values. ETC addressed past concerns and immediately took action to resolve any lingering issues. ETC, through its actions, appears to be looking to establish a fair and transparent partnership with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, in the best interest of our surrounding communities. We cannot ignore the positive results infrastructure projects such as this one deliver to the region.

It is my most sincere hope that the Commissioners support this existing settlement. By offering their support, both parties can go forward accomplishing their mutual goals – supporting Pennsylvania residents /businesses and bringing reliable energy safely to communities across the Keystone State.
