**Re: Duquesne Light Company – Default Service Plan IX Compliance Filing
Docket No. M-2021-3028911
Supplement No. 31 to Tariff Electric – PA. P.U.C. No. 25**

Dear Secretary Chiavetta:

On October 1, 2021, Duquesne Light Company (“Duquesne Light” or the “Company”) submitted for filing Supplement No. 31 to Tariff No. 25 – Retail Tariff. The cover letter accompanying that filing erroneously misidentified Supplement No. 31’s applicable associated Default Service Plan and effective date. This information is correctly represented in Supplement No. 31 itself; however, for avoidance of potential doubt, the Company is filing this letter to confirm that Supplement No. 31 was filed in compliance with the Company’s Default Service Plan IX, and has an effective date of December 1, 2021.

Additionally, as the Company’s October 1 filing observed, the RFP results filed along with Supplement No. 31 reflect the use of a Capacity Proxy Price for the 2023/2024 PJM Delivery Year, pursuant to the Commission’s Order entered September 15, 2021, at Docket No. P-2021-3027796. Please note that the default supply rates provided in Supplement No. 31 also reflect a reconciliation of the Capacity Proxy Price used in the Company’s March 2021 RFP for the 2022/2023 delivery year, pursuant to the Commission’s Order dated January 14, 2021 at Docket No. P-2020-3023149.¹ Subsequent to the Company’s March 2021 RFP, PJM established a capacity price for the 2022/2023 delivery year, so Supplement No. 31 reflects a true-up for the difference between the 2022/2023 capacity proxy price and actual capacity price. See Attachment A, page 6, of the supporting documentation included in the Company’s October 1 filing.

¹ See p. 3 (“Duquesne Light states that winning wholesale suppliers of its 24-month FPFR contracts procured in March 2021 would be paid the auction closing price, subject to subsequent true-up for the portion of the contracts that extend into the 2022/2023 delivery period. Duquesne Light also states that after the PJM capacity prices are set, the suppliers will be debited or credited, as applicable, for the differences between the CPP and the applicable PJM capacity price.”)
