SECTION 1
RULES & REGULATIONS

ITEM 5 - SCOPE OF CARRIER'S OPERATING AUTHORITY

Rates, rules and regulations named in this tariff, or as amended, apply to the transportation of household goods, in use, between points in Pennsylvania.

ITEM 10 - GOVERNING PUBLICATIONS

For rates, rules, regulations and provisions applicable to the transportation of household goods, in use, except as otherwise specifically provided herein, see Tariff Freight Pa. P.U.C. No. 53 (Carrier Directory No. 53), loose-leaf revisions thereto and successive issues thereof, issued by Tristate Household Goods Tariff Conference, Inc., Agent.

ITEM 15 - DECLARED VALUE

Rates and charges named herein applicable when the value declared by shipper does not exceed sixty (60) cents per pound, per article. For method of determining rates when declared value exceeds sixty (60) cents per pound, per article, see Governing Tariff.

ITEM 20 - CLASSIFICATION OF PROPERTY

Class 1 shipments are personal effects and property used or to be used in a dwelling when a part of the equipment or supply of such dwelling and such other similar property: except that this subparagraph shall not be construed to include property moving from a factory or store, except such property as the householder has purchased with the intent to use in his dwelling and which is transported at the request of, and the transportation charges paid to the carrier by the householder.

▲ ITEM 25 - HANDLING FEE

Carrier will assess a handling fee of 3.0% of the charged amount on both under forty (40) miles and over forty (40) miles relocations paid for with a credit card.

SECTION 2

ADDITIONAL SERVICES

ITEM 100 - PACKING AND UNPACKING SERVICE

Note 1: Rates shown are for packing containers and materials only and containers will be considered to have been retained by the shipper or consignee. The rates shown do not include labor for packing or unpacking.

Note 2: When carrier is requested by shipper to perform packing or unpacking service, hourly rates contained in Section 3, Item 200-C, will be assessed.

SECTION 3
SCHEDULE OF RATES

Item 200-C

Applicable to the Transportation of CLASS 1 SHIPMENTS, in use, (Item 20), transported distances of forty (40) miles and less.

Subject to Notes AA and 1 to 7 below, the transportation charges on any shipment shall be a COMBINATION of the applicable TRAVELING CHARGE named in Column 1 plus HOURLY CHARGE at applicable rates named in Columns 2, 3, and 4.

NOTE 1 - Traveling charges (Column 1) are in addition to hourly rates (Columns 2, 3 and 4).

NOTE 2 - Hourly rates (Columns 2, 3 and 4) are based on the day or days as indicated, during which services are performed.

NOTE 3 - Hourly rates (Columns 2, 3, and 4) computed in half-hour periods; fractions of one-half hour considered as one-half hour.

Item 200-C Cancels Item 200-B (continued)

NOTE 4 - When a holiday falls on a Saturday, the rates in Columns 1 and 2 shall be applicable.

NOTE 5 - **Minimum Transportation Charge (PEAK SEASON - June 1st thru September 30th):** Sundays and Holidays: eight (8) hours plus applicable travel time at rates named in Columns 1 and 2. Saturdays (any hour): five (5) hours plus applicable travel time at rates named in Columns 1 and 4. Weekdays (any hour): five (5) hours plus applicable travel time at rates named in Columns 1 and 3 or Columns 1 and 4.

Minimum Transportation Charge (NON-PEAK SEASON - October 1st thru May 31st): Sundays and Holidays, eight (8) hours plus applicable travel time at rates named in Columns 1 and 2. Saturdays (any hour): four (4) hours plus applicable travel time at rates named in Columns 1 and 4. Weekdays (any hour): four (4) hours plus applicable travel time at rates named in Columns 1 and 3 or Columns 1 and 4.

NOTE 6 - Carrier will supply and charge for supervisor or supervisors as requested by shipper. Hourly rate for each supervisor will be computed from time of arrival of vehicles and men at first point of origin until completion of unloading and dismissal of vehicle and men at final destination unless other time of arrival or dismissal is provided by agreement between shipper and carrier.

NOTE 7 - When service commences, at the request of the shipper, after 5:00PM and before 8:00AM, rates shall be at overtime rates as shown in Column 4.

NOTE AA - Travel charge to be based on the applicable transportation rates shown in Columns 2, 3, and 4 and will apply as follows based on the combined actual road miles from the carrier's terminal to the first point of origin and from final destination back to the carrier's terminal using Mileage Guide No. 40 or a software program designed to calculate mileage, such as, Google Maps or MapQuest.

0 - 10 miles	1/2 hour
11 - 20 miles	1 hour
21 - 40 miles	1 1/2 hours
41 - 60 miles	2 hours

For mileage in excess of 60 miles, a travel time charge of 1/2 hour will be assessed for each additional 20 miles.
