Please be advised that the following is our response to Margaret A Morris, Esquire at Reger Rizzo & Darnell LLP with regards to the motion of Metropolitan Edison company for Judgment on the Pleadings

PROCEDURAL BACKGROUND

1 Agreed

2 Agreed, however every piece of correspondence or communication we received regarding the project in question came from either Met Ed, First Energy, or AFS representing First Energy. The first time that we became aware of the fact that MAIT was the actual owner of the transmission lines was from a letter dated on September 27, 2021 from Ms. Morris. At that time, we sent notification to you that we would like to have our complaint amended to reflect the above fact.

3 We acknowledged that MAIT is the owner of the transmission lines, but see point 2 above. Prior to Miss Morris's letter, there was no apparent way any complainant would ever suspected that the owners of these transmission lines ever included MAIT.

4 It is our understanding that MAIT was formed by and is jointly owned by First Energy Transmission, Metropolitan Edison, Pennsylvania Electric, and Jersey Central Power and Light. These are all First Energy Companies. per the Pennsylvania Utility Commission between Mid Atlantic Interstate Transmission LLC, Metropolitan Edison Company and Pennsylvania Electric. (Again note that our initial formal complaint was filed to include Met Ed and First Energy per Point 1 of Ms. Morris's motion of January 10, 2022.) MAIT, an affiliate of First Energy Service Company, will be included in our amended formal complaint with the PUC.

5 This meeting was held on January 28, 2022 as scheduled.

6-12 Acknowledged without comment.

13 We acknowledge that Met Ed it is not the sole owner of the transmission lines in question, however it is our understanding that they are a partial owner of MAIT along with First Energy per point 4 above.

14 See point 13 above. If so, perhaps Met Ed should not have had their name on every piece of correspondence that we have received regarding this project.

CONCLUSION

As stated above, we will add Mid Atlantic Interstate Transmission to our formal complaint with the Pennsylvania Utility Commission. We cannot in good conscience remove Metropolitan Edison from the complaint. Our major concern is not who technically owns these lines or who's electricity they are transmitting. This project of replacing the poles and wires in our neighborhood is part of First Energy's "Energizing the Future" initiative in Met Ed and Penelec's service areas with no regard shown to our concerns about the safety and integrity of our neighborhood.
