**PRELIMINARY OBJECTION OF
PPL ELECTRIC UTILITIES CORPORATION TO THE
COMPLAINT OF JOHN BARRICK**

TO THE PENNSYLVANIA PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION:

AND NOW, comes PPL Electric Utilities Corporation (“PPL Electric” or the “Company”) and hereby files this Preliminary Objection, pursuant to the regulations of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (“Commission”) at 52 Pa. Code § 5.101, and respectfully requests that the Commission dismiss the above-captioned Formal Complaint (“Complaint”) filed by John Barrick (“Complainant”) in its entirety because the Commission lacks subject matter jurisdiction due to the Complainant’s active Chapter 13 bankruptcy proceeding at Docket No. 1:16-bk-05140-HWV.

In support thereof, PPL Electric states as follows:

I. BACKGROUND

1. PPL Electric is a “public utility” and an “electric distribution company” as those terms are defined under the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. §§ 102 and 2803, subject to the regulatory jurisdiction of the Commission.

2. PPL Electric furnishes electric distribution, transmission, and provider of last resort electric supply services to approximately 1.4 million customers throughout its certificated service territory, which includes all or portions of twenty-nine counties and encompasses approximately 10,000 square miles in eastern and central Pennsylvania.

3. On March 24, 2022, PPL Electric was served with the above-captioned Formal Complaint filed by the Complainant.

4. In the Complaint, the Complainant requests a payment agreement consistent with the terms of the “original” payment agreement he entered into with the Company, under which he would pay the current monthly bill plus \$120. (Complaint ¶ 5.)

5. On December 20, 2016, the Complainant and Danelle Barrick filed a petition for Chapter 13 bankruptcy with the U.S. Bankruptcy Court for the Middle District of Pennsylvania at Docket No. 1:16-bk-05140-HWV (“Chapter 13 Petition”).

6. A true and correct copy of the Chapter 13 Petition is attached hereto as **PPL Electric Exhibit A**.

7. The Chapter 13 Petition proceeding remains active as of the filing date of this Preliminary Objection.

8. A true and correct copy of the docket sheet for the Chapter 13 Petition proceeding is attached hereto as **PPL Electric Exhibit B**.

9. PPL Electric herein files this Preliminary Objection to the Complaint. For the reasons explained below, PPL Electric respectfully requests that the Commission summarily dismiss the Complaint because the Complainant lacks subject matter jurisdiction due to the Complainant’s active Chapter 13 bankruptcy proceeding.

II. STANDARD OF REVIEW

10. Pursuant to the Commission's regulations, preliminary objections in response to a pleading may be filed on several grounds, including:

- (1) Lack of Commission jurisdiction or improper service of the pleading initiating the proceeding.
- (2) Failure of a pleading to conform to this chapter or the inclusion of scandalous or impertinent matter.
- (3) Insufficient specificity of a pleading.
- (4) Legal insufficiency of a pleading.
- (5) Lack of capacity to sue, nonjoinder of a necessary party or misjoinder of a cause of action.
- (6) Pendency of a prior proceeding or agreement for alternative dispute resolution.
- (7) Standing of a party to participate in the proceeding.

52 Pa. Code § 5.101(a) (emphasis added).

11. In ruling on preliminary objections, the Presiding Officer must accept as true all well-pled allegations of material facts as well as all inferences reasonably deducible therefrom. *Stilp v. Cmwlth.*, 910 A.2d 775, 781 (Pa. Cmwlth. 2006) (citing *Dep't of Gen. Servs. v. Bd. of Claims*, 881 A.2d 14 (Pa. Cmwlth. 2005)). However, the Presiding Officer need not accept as true conclusions of law, unwarranted inferences from facts, argumentative allegations, or expressions of opinion. *Stanton-Negley Drug Co. v. Dep't of Pub. Welfare*, 927 A.2d 671, 673 (Pa. Cmwlth. 2007). Notwithstanding, any doubt must be resolved in favor of the non-moving party. *Stilp*, at 781.

12. In addition, the Presiding Officer must determine whether, based on the factual pleadings, if recovery is possible. *See Rok v. Flaherty*, 527 A.2d 211, 214 (Pa. Cmwlth. 1987).

Indeed, for preliminary objections to be sustained, it must appear with certainty that the law will permit no recovery. *See Stilp*, at 781; *Milliner v. Enck*, 709 A.2d 417, 418 (Pa. Super. 1998).

III. PRELIMINARY OBJECTION

A. PRELIMINARY OBJECTION NO. 1 – THE COMMISSION LACKS SUBJECT MATTER JURISDICTION OVER THE COMPLAINT BECAUSE THE COMPLAINANT HAS AN ACTIVE CHAPTER 13 BANKRUPTCY PROCEEDING

13. PPL Electric incorporates by reference Paragraphs 1 through 12 as if fully set forth herein.

14. The Complaint should be dismissed because the Commission lacks subject matter jurisdiction due to the Complainant’s active Chapter 13 bankruptcy proceeding.

15. “[I]t is well established that the Commission lacks jurisdiction to order a payment arrangement for a customer with an active Chapter 13 bankruptcy proceeding.” *Kessler v. PECO Energy Co.*, 2020 Pa. PUC LEXIS 277, at *10 (Order entered Mar. 18, 2020) (citing *Matronics v. West Penn Power Co.*, Docket No. C-2017-2617235 (Order entered Jan. 9, 2020)).

16. “Generally any bankruptcy petition filed pursuant to the U.S. Bankruptcy Code will operate as a stay and bars either the commencement or continuation of a judicial or administrative proceeding against the debtor where the proceeding was commenced prior to the start of the bankruptcy proceeding or to recover a claim against the debtor that arose before the commencement of the bankruptcy proceeding.” *Steele v. Metro. Edison Co.*, 2020 Pa. PUC LEXIS 444, at *11 (Order entered Aug. 27, 2020) (citing 11 U.S.C. § 362(a)(1)).

17. However, when there is an active Chapter 13 bankruptcy proceeding, the Commission lacks jurisdiction over both pre- and post-bankruptcy filing arrearages. *Danjou v. West Penn Power Co.*, Docket No. F-2018-3006430, pp. 8-9 (Order entered July 22, 2019) (“*Danjou*”) (citations omitted).

18. As the Commission explained in *Danjou*:

Since the nature of a Chapter 13 bankruptcy is an on-going repayment plan in which all of a debtor's assets (including property, income and debts acquired pre-petition and post-petition) are included in the debtor's estate under the exclusive control of the bankruptcy trustee, the Commission is without jurisdiction to issue an order that affects the disposition of the income or assets of a debtor who has an active Chapter 13 bankruptcy proceeding even where the subject of the payment arrangement is a post-petition arrearage.

Id. (emphasis added).

19. Here, the Complainant's Chapter 13 bankruptcy proceeding remains active as of the date of this Preliminary Objection. *See* PPL Electric Exhibit B.

20. Further, the Complainant's only request for relief is that the Commission grant him a new payment agreement that is consistent with the terms of his "original" payment agreement. (Complaint ¶ 5.)

21. Therefore, under well-established Commission precedent, the Commission lacks subject matter jurisdiction over the instant Complaint because: (1) he has an active Chapter 13 bankruptcy proceeding; and (2) the Complainant is requesting a payment agreement.

22. Thus, the Commission should dismiss the Complaint pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 5.101(a)(1) and (a)(4).

IV. CONCLUSION

WHEREFORE, PPL Electric Utilities Corporation respectfully requests that the above-captioned Formal Complaint filed by John Barrick be dismissed in its entirety pursuant 52 Pa. Code § 5.101(a)(1) and (a)(4).
