Dear Secretary Chiavetta:

Pursuant to the Commission's Interim Guidelines Regarding Notification by an Electric Generation Supplier of Operational Changes Affecting Customer Service and Contracts (Docket No. M-00960890F0013), please accept this joint letter as notice by Community Energy, Inc., (Electric Generation Supplier License No. A-110152) ("CEI"), and Energy Cooperative Association of Pennsylvania, dba The Energy Co-op (Electric Generation Supplier License No. A-110056) ("The Energy Co-op") that CEI will assign certain of its Pennsylvania customer contracts to The Energy Co-op. All of the customer contracts being assigned are located in the territories of PPL and PECO, and The Energy Co-op is licensed to serve customers in both of those territories.

The assignment will take effect on or about May 25, 2022, and The Energy Co-op will begin serving the assigned customers at that time. CEI is not assigning all of its customer contracts to The Energy Co-op, and after the assignment, CEI will continue to have some customers in Pennsylvania. CEI will remain in active operation to serve its remaining Pennsylvania customers, and thereafter will determine whether it will continue to operate in Pennsylvania. As such, this letter should not be considered a notice of cessation pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 54.41. Any such filing will be separately made by CEI if and when appropriate.

The assignment transaction will be seamless for customers, whose contracts are all assignable. The Energy Co-op will assume the assigned CEI contracts as they stand. Accordingly, customers will experience no change in terms or conditions for the duration of their contracts. CEI does not apply fees for customers who leave prior to the end of their contract, and The Energy Co-op will honor this provision as well.

As required by the aforementioned *Interim Guidelines*, CEI and The Energy Co-op have sent the enclosed materials to customers to notify them of the upcoming transition of their accounts. The materials include a joint letter to customers from CEI and The Energy Co-op and a timeline of what customers can expect to happen next.

CEI and The Energy Co-op customer service agents have been trained to talk to customers as the transition occurs, and to explain what the transition means for the customers. CEI and The Energy Co-op are confident that this assignment transaction will be seamless for customers.

Both CEI and The Energy Co-op are compliant with their Alternative Energy Portfolio Standards obligations and compliant with all Commission assessments and all financial security instruments are current. **CONFIDENTIAL** copies of CEI's and the Energy Co-op's Quarterly Reports of Gross Receipts for the last four quarters are being submitted through the Secretary Bureau's SharePoint site. CEI and The Energy Co-op respectfully request that these reports be filed under seal, because they contain **CONFIDENTIAL** business and financial information about the companies that could cause competitive harm if publicly disclosed.

Copies of this filing are being served in accordance with that attached Certificate of Service. The companies respectfully request that the Commission note the transaction, and the companies will continue to notify the Commission of any changes. In the meantime, please contact the undersigned with any questions or concerns.

## **Transition Schedule**

Here is additional information about the transition of your 100% Pennsylvania-sourced wind and solar electricity supply from Community Energy to The Energy Co-op:

- Community Energy and The Energy Co-op have provided notice of the assignment to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission.
- The assignment of your renewable electricity supply contract from Community Energy to The Energy Co-op is expected to become effective on or shortly after May 25, 2022.
- Around that date, The Energy Co-op will notify your electric utility that it will become your new renewable electricity supplier.
- Your electric utility will continue to read your meter, issue your bill, and respond to emergencies and outages.
- Community Energy will continue to supply your renewable electricity until approximately May 25, 2022. The Energy Co-op will automatically begin supplying your renewable electricity on or shortly after that date, without any interruption. You are not required to do anything.
- The bill you receive from your electric utility will reflect Community Energy's charges to you up until its last date of service to you, and then will reflect The Energy Co-op's charges to you starting with its first date of service to you.
- Your enrollment with The Energy Co-op will remain in effect until cancelled either by you or by The Energy Co-op.
