RULES & REGULATIONS

ITEM 10 - GOVERNING PUBLICATIONS

For rates, rules, regulations and provisions applicable to the transportation of household goods, in use, except as otherwise specifically provided herein, see Tariff Freight Pa. P.U.C. No. 53 (Carrier Directory No. 53), loose-leaf revisions thereto and successive issues thereof, issued by Tristate Household Goods Tariff Conference, Inc., Agent.

ITEM 20 - CLASSIFICATION OF PROPERTY

Class 1 shipments are personal effects and property used or to be used in a dwelling when a part of the equipment or supply of such dwelling and such other similar property: except that this subparagraph shall not be construed to include property moving from a factory or store, except such property as the householder has purchased with the intent to use in his dwelling and which is transported at the request of, and the transportation charges paid to the carrier by the householder.

ITEM 30 - DECLARED VALUE

Rates and charges named herein applicable when the value declared by shipper does not exceed sixty (60) cents per pound per article. For the method of determining rates when declared value exceeds sixty (60) cents per pound per article, see Governing Tariff.

▲ ITEM 40 - PACKING AND UNPACKING

Packing and unpacking will be performed on an hourly basis using rates in Section 3, Item 300, on Page 4 of this tariff plus the cost of containers shown in Section 2, Item 100, on Page 3 of this tariff.

▲ ITEM 50 - FULL VALUATION PROTECTION

The value declared on the shipment must be at least equal to the weight of the shipment multiplied by \$4.00 per pound, subject to a minimum declaration of \$5,000.00. For example, if the shipment weighs 5,000 pounds, the minimum value that must be declared is \$20,000.00. A higher lump sum amount may be chosen based on an estimate of what it will cost to replace all of the contents included in the shipment.

ADDITIONAL SERVICE CHARGES

(When furnished to shipper by carrier). Rates are in dollars and cents per each unit, except as noted. (Applicable on shipments transported under forty (40) miles only).

ITEM 300

Applicable on the transportation of CLASS 1 SHIPMENTS (Item 20) transported distances of forty (40) miles and less.

Subject to Notes 1 to 7 below, the transportation charge on any shipment shall be a <u>COMBINATION</u> of the applicable <u>TRAVELING</u> <u>CHARGE</u> named in Column 1 plus the HOURLY CHARGE at applicable rates named in Columns 2, 2, 4 and 5.

Hourly rates apply only from time of arrival of vehicles and men at first point of origin (continued during all loading, transportation from first point of origin to final destination and unloading) until completion of unloading and dismissal of vehicles and men by the shipper at destination.

Traveling charges cover traveling to first point of origin and traveling from final destination, irrespective of actual time involved in such traveling.

NOTE 3 - Hourly rates (Columns 2, 3, 4 and 5) computed in quarter-hour periods; fractions of one-quarter hour considered as

one-quarter hour.

NOTE 4 - Minimum transportation charges: Monday thru Sunday (any hour) - two (2) hours at rates named in Column 1 and Columns 2, 3, 4 and 5.

NOTE 5 - Rates named in Columns 2, 3, 4 and 5 apply only to 12:00 midnight. After midnight, rates for the next day are applicable. NOTE 6 - Carrier will supply and charges for supervisor or supervisors as requested by shipper or required by carrier. Hourly rate for each supervisor will be computed from time of arrival of vehicles and men at first point of origin until completion of unloading and dismissal of vehicles and men at final destination unless other time of arrival or dismissal of supervisor is provided by agreement between shipper and carrier.

NOTE 7 - A flat charge based on one (1) hour at the applicable transportation rate shown in Columns 2, 3, 4 or 5 will be assessed to cover traveling charges to and from the job.
