**RE: UGI Utilities, Inc. Revised Joint 2020-2025 USECP
July 18, 2022 Compliance Filing**

Overview

On May 21, 2020, UGI Utilities, Inc. – Gas Division and UGI Utilities, Inc. – Electric Division (collectively, UGI) filed a Petition (May 2020 Petition) at the above dockets proposing amendments to its joint 2020-2025 Universal Service and Energy Conservation Plan (2020 USECP). On June 16, 2022, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Commission) entered an Order (June 16 Order) approving the May 2020 Petition and directing that a compliance filing be made. On July 18, 2022, UGI filed its revised joint 2020 USECP (July 18 Compliance Filing). This Secretarial Letter establishes that the July 18 Compliance Filing has been found to be compliant with the June 16 Order.

Background

UGI’s proposed amendments consisted of:

- Amending the Customer Assistance Program Percent of Income Payment (CAP PIP) energy burden levels.
- Removing “payment troubled” as a requirement for CAP eligibility.
- Removing the requirement that CAP customers must assign LIHEAP grants to UGI.

In its June 16 Order, the Commission directed UGI to submit a revised joint 2020 USECP within 30 days. UGI was directed to reflect changes consistent with the May 2020 Petition and include updated CAP enrollment and budget projections in the compliance filing. June 16 Order at 22, OP #6. The Commission approved the amended 2020 USECP conditioned upon UGI making the changes directed in the June 16 Order.

On July 18, 2022, UGI filed clean and redlined versions of its revised joint 2020 USECP.¹ To date, no protests or other responsive pleadings have been filed relative to the July 18 Compliance Filing. The changes and requisite updates to CAP enrollment and budget projections are

reflected in the July 18 Compliance Filing. Staff in the Commission's Bureau of Consumer Services (BCS) has reviewed the July 18 Compliance Filing and has not identified any areas of non-compliance with the June 16 Order.

Conclusion

Accordingly, BCS finds the July 18 Compliance Filing to be compliant with the June 16 Order. Parties have the right to seek reconsideration of this staff action. These staff determinations relative to the review of the July 18 Compliance Filing will be deemed to be the final action of the Commission unless reconsideration is sought from the Commission within 20 days after service of this Secretarial Letter. *See* 52 Pa. Code § 5.44 (relating to petitions for appeal from actions of the staff).
