Dear Secretary Chiavetta,

Enclosed via electronic filing please find the replacement pages of Aqua Pennsylvania Wastewater, Inc. Supplement 3 to Sewer – P.A.P.U.C. (“Supplement No. 3) with changes that reflect Aqua Pennsylvania Wastewater, Inc.’s (“Aqua” or the “Company”) establishment of a contract rate for large industrial wastewater customers via a rider. Supplement 3 contains an issue date of December 7, 2022, and an effective date of February 5, 2023. These changes included in this filing will replace tariff pages 1, 2, 3, 4, 16 and 17.

Also, please find the following information submitted as supporting data in accordance with 52 Pa. Code §53.52(a):

1. The specific reasons for each change.

In order to ensure that large industrial wastewater customers with a viable competitive alternative to service from the Company remain customers of the Company and refrain from selecting the alternative to the detriment of the Company, a new contracted rate must be established via a service agreement, or contract.

2. The total number of customers served by the utility.

The Company currently serves 61,323 wastewater customers.

3. A calculation of the number of customers, by tariff subdivision, whose bill will be affected by the change:

The Company currently serves a small number of large industrial wastewater customers. These customers must successfully adhere to the criteria in the rider before the Company can quantify how many bills will be expected to change.

4. The effect of the change on the utility's customers.

Large industrial customers that are eligible per the criteria spelled out in the rider would be eligible to enter into a service agreement with the Company that establishes a new contracted rate for the customer's sewer service. If a rider is not established and these customers are not charged a contracted rate, these customers can leave via a viable competitive alternative which is detrimental, not only to the Company, but to the other customers served in their service area as well.

5. The direct or indirect effect of the proposed change on the utility's revenue and expenses.

There is no direct or indirect effect of the proposed change on the utility's revenues and expenses. Until large wastewater customers successfully meet the criteria established in the rider, the Company cannot quantify nor opine as to how the Company's revenues would be impacted.

6. The effect of the change on the service rendered by the utility.

The Company anticipates that these changes will have no effect on the service rendered by the utility.

7. All factors considered by the utility in its determination to make the change. The list shall include a comprehensive statement about why these factors were chosen and the relative importance of each.

The Company has considered current and future service areas that have grown substantially through acquisition and how there are no current Riders that exist in the current wastewater tariff for this circumstance, unlike the Company's water tariff.

8. Studies undertaken by the utility in order to specifically address the proposed changes.

The Company did not undertake a study to specifically address the proposed changes.



SCHEDULE OF RATES**RIDER LWCUR – LARGE WASTEWATER CUSTOMER USER****I. Applicability**

The rate applies throughout the territory served under this tariff.

II. Availability

The rider is available to a customer or prospect Large Wastewater customer that:

1. Discharges wastewater into Aqua Wastewater's collection system resulting from industrial processes;
2. Enters into a Service Agreement for a term of not less than 3 years; and,
3. Has a viable competitive alternative to service from the Company and, unless a new rate is established, the customer intends to select that alternative to the detriment of the Company and its customers.
4. In addition to 1-3, the Company may consider whether the customer or prospective Large Customer has made or agrees to make a substantial contribution of capital for facilities or facilities themselves to the Company in order to become or remain a customer and whether a customer plans to locate or retain a substantial facility in the Company's existing or applied-for franchise territory that provides substantial economic development and employment in the immediate local or Commonwealth.

The Company shall require documentation to establish, to the Company's satisfaction, the existence of a competitive alternative along with any other applicable qualifying condition stated above. Such documentation may include, but is not limited to an affidavit of the customer or if, the customer is a corporation, an affidavit of one of more of its senior managers or its officers.

II. Rate

The rate(s) to be charged qualifying customers under this rider shall be negotiated and set forth in the Service Agreement, provided, however, that such rate(s): (1) shall not be less than the Minimum Rate; and (2) shall be subject to an Escalation Clause, as hereafter defined.

Minimum Rate: The Minimum Rate shall be sufficient to recover (1) variable Wastewater Treatment Cost (i.e., electric power and any chemical costs not otherwise covered by any applicable surcharges for BOD, TSS, etc.); plus (2) the fixed costs (depreciation and pre-tax return) on the facilities necessary to serve the customer; and (3) some portion of the fixed costs of the Company's wastewater treatment and collection facilities.

SCHEDULE OF RATES

RIDER LWCUR – LARGE WASTEWATER CUSTOMER USER (cont'd)

Escalation Clause: The rate set forth in the Service Agreement shall be subject to an Escalation Clause, during the original and any renewal terms of the Service Agreement, which may be a fixed annual percentage or may be based upon changes in published price indices and/or changes in the Company's cost of service, as the Company and the qualifying customer shall agree.

Filing with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission/Confidentiality: Service Agreements entered into between the Company and qualifying customers under this rider shall be filed with the Commission on a confidential basis within thirty (30) days of their execution and shall not be subject to disclosure except by Petition made to and granted by the Commission pursuant to 52 Pa Code §1.74.
