RULES & REGULATIONS

ITEM 10 - GOVERNING PUBLICATIONS

For rates, rules, regulations and provisions applicable to the transportation of household goods, in use, except as otherwise specifically provided herein, see Tariff Freight Pa. P.U.C. No. 53 (Carrier Directory No. 53), supplements thereto and reissues thereof, issued by Tristate Household Goods Tariff Conference, Inc., Agent.

ITEM 20 - CLASSIFICATION OF PROPERTY

<u>Class 1 shipments</u> are personal effects and property used or to be used in a dwelling when a part of the equipment or supply of such dwelling and such other similar property: except that this subparagraph shall not be construed to include property moving from a factory or store, except such property as the householder has purchased with the intent to use in his dwelling and which is transported at the request of and the transportation charges paid to the carrier by the householder.

ITEM 30 - DECLARED VALUE

Rates and charges named herein applicable when the value declared by shipper does not exceed sixty (60) cents per pound, per article. For method of determining rates when declared value exceeds sixty (60) cents per pound, per article, see Governing Tariff.

SECTION 1

ADDITIONAL SERVICE CHARGES

Item 100

PACKING CONTAINERS:

Packing container charges include containers and materials which remain the property of the consignee.

PACKING AND UNPACKING LABOR:

Labor for packing and unpacking will be based on hourly rates in Item 200 on Page 5 of this tariff.

Note 1: Cubical content must be shown on all cartons.

Note 2: When cartons of more than 3 cubic feet capacity are used and no rate is shown for the size carton used, charges shall be based on the rate for the next lower size carton shown.

Note 3: In applying charges for mattress cartons, if the size furnished exceeds the dimensions for which charges are shown, the charge for the next greater size shall apply.

Note 4: The packing service for crates (specifically constructed for mirrors, paintings, glass or marble tops and similar fragile articles) includes packing and the construction of such special crates and containers which remain the property of the consignee.

<u>Note 5</u>: In the event that two or more standard containers must be joined together because of the size, shape or character of the item or items to be packed, the charge for the container shall be the combined charge reflected above for all containers used.

ITEM 200

APPLICABLE TO THE TRANSPORTATION OF HOUSEHOLD GOODS, IN USE, FOR DISTANCES OF 40 MILES OR LESS (Dwelling-To-Dwelling Movements) TRANSPORTED BETWEEN POINTS IN PENNSYLVANIA - (per ITEM 20):

Subject to Notes 1 to 7 below, the transportation charges on any shipment shall be a <u>COMBINATION</u> of the applicable <u>TRAVELING</u> <u>CHARGE</u> named in Column 1 plus <u>HOURLY CHARGE</u> at applicable rates named in Columns 2, 3 and 4.

Hourly rates apply only from time of arrival of vehicles and men at first point of origin (continue during all loading, transportation from the first point of origin to the final destination and unloading) until completion of unloading and dismissal of vehicles and men by the shipper at destination.

Traveling charges cover traveling to the first point of origin and traveling from final destination, irrespective of the actual time involved in such traveling.

- NOTE 3 Hourly Rates (Column 2, 3 and 4) computed in half-hour periods; fraction of half-hour considered one-half hour.
- NOTE 4 Minimum total transportation charge on Sundays and Holidays (any hour): four hours at rates named in Columns 1 and 2.

Minimum total transportation charge on Saturdays (any hour) and Weekdays, 6:01PM to 6:00AM: four hours at rates named in Columns

- 1 and 4. Minimum total transportation charge other than Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays (6:01AM to 6:00PM): four hours at rates named in Columns 1 and 3. All minimum times include the travel charge.
- NOTE 5 Rates in Column 4 apply only from 6:01PM to 12:00 Midnight on any day when a higher rate is shown for the following day.
- NOTE 6 Carrier will supply and charge for supervisor or supervisors as requested by shipper. Hourly rates for each supervisor will be computed from time of arrival of vehicles and men at first point of origin until completion of unloading and dismissal of vehicles and men at the final destination unless other time of arrival or dismissal of supervisor(s) is provided by agreement between shipper and carrier.
- NOTE 7 Travel charge to be based on the applicable transportation rates shown in Columns 2, 3, and 4. Travel time to be calculated in one-half hour increments using the combined actual time required to travel from the carrier's terminal to the first point of origin and from the destination back to the carrier's terminal. Fraction of one-half hour considered one-half hour. Carrier may also use a software program designed to calculate mileage, such as, Google Maps, MapQuest or TruckRouter for the travel time.
