Your Honor,

The purpose of this letter is to report on the status of the above-referenced matter. Pursuant to the Interim Order Granting Respondent's Motion for Continuance issued on April 20, 2023, PPL Electric Utilities Corporation's ("PPL Electric" or the "Company") Counsel contacted Jason Thomas ("Complainant") to confer and provide at least three alternative hearing dates in June 2023 when both parties and their witnesses are available for hearing.

Unfortunately, due to multiple scheduling conflicts, there was no date in June 2023 in which all of PPL Electric's witnesses were available. Together, PPL Electric and the Complainant were able to identify one date in July in which both parties were available, *i.e.*, July 6, 2023.

To provide context, PPL Electric presents the following list of its intended witnesses and their conflicts with hearing dates in June 2023:

- Ms. Courtney Asteak, Regional Engineering Manager for PPL Electric, who is on vacation from June 1 through June 12;
- Mr. Brad McGinty, Senior Engineer for PPL Electric, who is out of the country on vacation from June 3 through June 23;

- Mr. Denis Pancoast, Senior Engineer - Tariff Rules, REMSI and Street Lighting for PPL Electric, who is on vacation from June 23 through June 26; and
- Ms. Kim Hanson, Claims Specialist for PPL Electric, who is out of the country on vacation from June 27 through July 4.

When PPL Electric contacted the Complainant regarding these scheduling restrictions, he represented that he also had several commitments in both June 2023 and July 2023 that restricted his availability to appear for the hearing in this matter. However, the Complainant did represent that he was willing to work with PPL Electric to find a date in July 2023 that works for both parties. Ultimately, the parties identified July 6, 2023, as a potential date for rescheduling the hearing.

If the July 6, 2023 hearing date does not work for Your Honor, PPL Electric will diligently work with the Complainant to try to identify other dates in July 2023 for the evidentiary hearing.


