**RE: PECO Energy Company 2023-2027 USECP Further Revised CAP
Application and Recertification Letters**

Overview

On June 16, 2022, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Commission) entered an Order (June 2022 Order) directing PECO Energy Company (PECO) to, *inter alia*, file and serve an updated application and recertification letters/forms for its customer assistance program (CAP) reflecting changes approved or directed in the June 2022 Order. June 2022 Order at 106, OP# 11.

Specifically, the June 2022 Order directed PECO to:

- Amend its CAP applications and recertification letters/forms to reflect that it will accept income from the last 30 days or last 12 months, whichever is more representative of the household's annual income, and how the income timeframe may impact the household's eligibility and benefits. June 2022 Order at 44-45.
- Clarify that the income documentation list on the CAP application is not comprehensive. June 2022 Order at 68.

On May 9, 2023, PECO filed a letter which included, *inter alia*, a revised application and recertification letters for its CAP (May 9 Compliance Filing). The Commission's Bureau of Consumer Services (BCS) reviewed the May 9 Compliance Filing and identified one area where the revised CAP application was inconsistent with the June 2022 Order. Specifically, the revised CAP application instructed customers to provide 30 days of documentation for several income types, which is inconsistent with the June 2022 Order. Revised CAP Application at 2. In all other respects, BCS found the revised CAP application and recertification letters in compliance with the June 2022 Order.

On May 16, 2023, BCS issued a Secretarial Letter directing PECO to file and serve a further revised CAP Application to address the compliance issue.

On June 5, 2023, PECO filed a further revised CAP application (June 5 Compliance Filing) which removes the language instructing customers to provide 30 days of income for specific income types. BCS has reviewed the June 5 Compliance Filing and finds no further compliance issues related to the June 2022 Order. To date, no protests or other responsive pleadings have been filed relative to the June 5 Compliance Filing.

Conclusion

Accordingly, BCS finds PECO's June 5 Compliance Filing to be compliant with the June 2022 Order. These staff determinations relative to the review of the June 5 Compliance Filing will be deemed to be the final action of the Commission unless reconsideration is sought from the Commission within 20 days after service of this Secretarial Letter. *See* 52 Pa. Code § 5.44 (relating to petitions for appeal from actions of the staff).
