Applicant requests a modification to the \$250,000 surety requirement. The Applicant is a broker/marketer that will not be taking title to electricity. Similarly, the Applicant will not be paying electricity bills on behalf of any of its customers. As noted above, the Applicant was formerly licensed as a broker in Pennsylvania, but had that license cancelled as a result of administrative oversight. While previously licensed, the Applicant was approved for the modified surety requirement from the Commission and at all times, had a \$10,000 bond in place with the PA PUC listed as the obligee on the bond. The original bond documents are attached as Exhibit 6. They are in the form of the bond attached to this application packet as Appendix F. This bond is still active. The receipt for the renewal of the bond, which was effective in November 2022, is attached as Exhibit 4. Applicant acknowledges the failure to supply the Commission with the receipt for the renewed bond. However, as noted above, the bond was always in place and the surety coverage from the Applicant never lapsed. The Applicant is seeking to continue to operate as it was operating prior to the Commission's February 2023 order.

CRITICAL BONDING NOTES:

Applicant is required to maintain a bond or other financial instrument the entire time it maintains an EGS license with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. If Applicant's security instrument is not continuous, Applicant <u>MUST</u> submit a Rider, Amendment, or Continuation Certificate annually based on the expiration date of its security instrument.

At least sixty days (60) prior to the security instrument's expiration date, Applicant should contact Stephen Jakab at siakab@pa.gov to determine the appropriate bonding amount based on a percentage of Applicant's gross receipts resulting from the sale of generated electricity consumed in Pennsylvania.
