The Applicant has access to a \$160,000,000 revolving credit facility (of which \$135,500,000 is available as of September 15, 2023) and a \$200,000,000 delay draw term loan facility (of which \$186,500,000 is available as of September 15, 2023. Both facilities were established in May 2022 and extend through May 2027. The Applicant also has access to equity funding resources from its owners, which are investment funds managed by or affiliated with Kohlberg Kravis Roberts & Co. L.P. ("KKR"). KKR is a leading global investment firm with nearly \$500 billion assets under management worldwide.

It will step into the shoes of another EGS, which will be the transitional provider of electric generation supplier services to the Allegheny County Airport. Applicant intends to purchase power from Three Rivers District Energy, LLC at wholesale, and then sell some of the electricity at retail to the Allegheny County Airport Authority. Any remaining electricity will be sold at retail to affiliates of the Applicant, using Duquesne Light Company's transmission and distribution facilities. Applicant will be primarily serving one large commercial customer, with any remaining electricity being sold to affiliates.

Energy Center Retailco LLC will use employees of Cordia, pursuant to an affiliated interest agreement between Community Energy Operating Company LLC and Community Energy Consolidated LLC "on behalf of all its existing and future direct and indirect subsidiaries." This agreement was approved by the Commission at Docket No. G-2022-3032856.

Energy Center Retailco LLC will use the equipment and facilities of Energy Center Pittsburgh.

Mark Schneider, Vice President of Energy Center Retailco LLC, is also the Northeast Regional General Manager of Cordia, which includes Energy Center Harrisburg LLC and Energy Center Pittsburgh LLC. As a result, he has experience contracting for supply and with Commission regulatory oversight.  - Net Metering Reports: Applicant shall be responsible to report any Net Metering per the Standards on http://www.puc.pa.gov/consumer-info/electricity/alternative-energy.aspx. Scroll down to the Net Metering Standards Section.
 - Applicant shall report to the Commission the percentages of total electricity supplied by each fuel source on an annual basis per 52 Pa. Code § 54.39(d).
 - Applicant will be required to meet periodic reporting requirements as may be issued by the Commission to fulfill the Commission's duty under Chapter 28 pertaining to reliability and to inform the Governor and Legislature of the progress of the transition to a fully competitive electric market.






