1. Columbia is a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania with a principal place of business at 121 Champion Way, Suite 100, Canonsburg, PA 15317. Columbia is engaged in the business of selling and distributing natural gas to retail customers within the Commonwealth, and therefore, is a “public utility” within the meaning of Section 102 of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. § 102, subject to the regulatory jurisdiction of the Commission. Columbia provides natural gas service to approximately 445,000 customers in 26 counties of Pennsylvania, pursuant to certificates of public convenience granted by the Commission.

2. Columbia seeks the Commission’s authorization to abandon service to two (2) inactive residential premises and two (2) inactive commercial premises in Fayette County, Pennsylvania. The names of the property owners and addresses of the affected premises (collectively referred to as the “Premises”) are:

3. The Premises previously received natural gas service from an approximate 250-foot section of distribution line that Columbia owns and operates, which Columbia refers to as the Dunbar LP System, a low-pressure distribution system. All the Premises have been inactive for at least five (5) years.
