MOTION FOR DEMAND OF OATHS

Pursuant to the Constitutions of Pennsylvania and the United States, and now specifically **Pennsylvania Article 6 § 3**, Nancy Colbert (Mrs. Colbert) acting by special appearance in the formal complaint C-2022-3036933 as one of the People in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, **not** as a legal entity “person,” “individual,” “party,” or “petitioner” as defined in PA Title 52§ 1.8. Definitions under the Pennsylvania Administrative Procedures Act, now demands Oaths be acknowledged by all public officials in this matter:

"I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will support, obey and defend the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of this Commonwealth and that I will discharge the duties of my office with fidelity."

Thus, Mrs. Colbert, never waiving constitutionally-protected rights (privileges and immunities inclusive), seeking administrative process as one of the People not under jurisdiction, since being subjected to “person,” “individual,” “party,” or

“petitioner” requires a commercial nexus with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in which that subject is granted privileges and consents to regulation by the Commonwealth, now demands that public officials in this matter support and defend the United States and Pennsylvania Constitutions that establish the authority of the People providing consent, and protect the People’s rights.

As Mrs. Colbert’s action derives from exercising the non-commercial, inalienable right to purchase electricity for her life needs under service agreement contract of monthly payment to PECO, now public officials involved in this matter must abide that distinction. Thus, Mrs Colbert, as one of the People, seeks remedy through the Law with all its obligations, incorporating constitutional, contract, property, and natural Law which prevent and forbid unlawful promise, interference of contracts, converting a right into a privilege, curtailing economic liberty for a class of citizens, depriving equal protection, and threatening life needs --- as so wonderfully established by our Founders in Philadelphia, 1776-1791, just down the road from PECO.

Similarly, pursuant to **PA Title 42 §2522**, this motion also incorporates herein Ms Scott’s Oath and any other “esquire” involved in this matter:

"I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will support, obey and defend the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of this Commonwealth and that I will discharge the duties of my office with fidelity, as well to the court as to the client, that I will use no falsehood, nor delay the cause of any person for lucre or malice."

WHEREFORE, Mrs. Colbert moves this administrative court, abiding its constitutional and legislatively-delegated limits, to acknowledge not only her acting in special appearance as one of the People in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for remedy through the Law, but also their responsibility to their Oaths, and demand all involved lawyers be responsible to their Oaths as well.
