**INTERIM ORDER
SETTING CONFERENCE BETWEEN PARTIES**

On or about March 22, 2024, Carol Strang ("Complainant") filed a Complaint against PPL Electric Utilities Corporation ("Respondent"), at the above-captioned docket number. On or about April 16, 2024, Respondent filed an Answer to the Complaint.

Based upon a review of the information contained in this material, the parties are hereby directed to discuss this matter to determine whether such discussion can result in a resolution of the Complaint and, if so, whether Complainant wants to withdraw the Complaint. Respondent shall contact Complainant concerning a mutually convenient date and time for Respondent and Complainant to hold a conference. The conference shall take place on or before May 15, 2024, unless this is not possible.

Within ten (10) days following the conference, May 25, 2025, Respondent shall file a short report with Teri-Lee Rhoades ("Mediator"), setting forth:

- (a) The time, date and place of the conference;
- (b) Who participated for each party; and
- (c) A statement on the results of the conference.

If it is not possible to have the conference by the date set for that purpose, Respondent shall file a report with the Mediator, on or before ten (10) days following the conference due date, giving the reason(s) why the due date could not be met.

In either situation, a report must be filed with the Mediator by the applicable due date set forth above.

If the parties do not resolve the Complaint on their own, they are entitled to a hearing. A hearing is a formal, adversarial proceeding which usually includes the presentation of oral testimony and other evidence before a Commission administrative law judge, who will then consider the case and make a written decision to resolve it. The Complainant must prove that the Respondent has violated the Public Utility Code, a regulation or an order of the Commission which would entitle the Complainant to the relief sought in the Complaint.
