**NOTICE THAT COMPLAINANT WILL APPEAL TO THE  
COMMONWEALTH COURT OF PENNSYLVANIA  
AND  
AFFIRMATION THAT THE CURRENT ELECTRIC METER REMAINS IN PLACE  
DURING ONGOING LEGAL PROCEEDINGS**

1. On January 28, 2024, Complainant filed with the PUC an Affirmation That The Current Electric Meter Remains In Place During Ongoing Legal Proceedings.
2. Complainant had been informed that her current electric meter will remain in place during her ongoing case.
3. Complainant now respectfully affirms this.
4. Complainant intends to submit an Appeal to the Commonwealth Court of Pennsylvania.
5. The current meter should remain in place until final disposition in this case is made at the appellate court level, whether it be the Commonwealth Court or the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania.
6. In addition, other legal actions are in process whose outcomes may well affect the path forward of Complainant's case:
  - a. Decision pending in *McKnight v. Pa. Pub. Util. Comm'n*, No. 1253 C.D. 2019.  
The Commonwealth Court issued an Opinion. The McKnights are appealing it.
  - b. Decision pending in the Declaratory Judgment of Petitioner Nancy Colbert.  
The Commonwealth Court sent this case on to the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania.
7. Complainant respectfully requests that the current meter remain in place, not only during her ongoing legal proceedings, but also until these other legal actions are completed in full because they may well impact her own case.
8. In leaving the current meter in place, Met-Ed will not be harmed since Complainant has automatic payments scheduled monthly.

Therefore, Complainant affirms that Met-Ed/FirstEnergy will allow the current electric meter to remain in place during Complainant's ongoing case. The current electric meter will stay in place

until: (1) a final disposition of her case is made at a higher court; and (2) final decisions are rendered in related cases, named *supra*, as these may impact the legal path forward for Complainant.
