Resolution No. CB-23-028, Dated December 3, 2023. Authorizes the Memorandum of Understanding between the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the Service Employees International Union (SEIU), Local 668. The Memorandum of Understanding provides for the establishment of rates of pay, hours of work, and other conditions of employment for the period July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2027.

Resolution No. CB-23-029, Dated December 3, 2023. Authorizes the Collective Bargaining Agreement between the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the Pennsylvania Liquor Enforcement Association, Liquor Law Enforcement Unit. The Collective Bargaining Agreement provides for the establishment of rates of pay, hours of work, and other conditions of employment for the period July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2027.

Resolution No. CB-23-030, Dated December 3, 2023. Authorizes the side letter with PLEA to provide the Pay Differential for certain LEO effective July 1, 2023.

Resolution No. CB-23-031, Dated December 20, 2023. Authorizes the side letter of agreement with the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, Council 13, to raise the daily lunch/meal reimbursement amounts which are outlined throughout the Master Agreement appendices executed on October 25, 2023.

Resolution No. CB-23-032, Dated December 20, 2023. Authorizes the side letter of agreement with the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, Council 13, to raise the daily lunch/meal reimbursement amounts which are outlined throughout the Master Memorandum appendices executed on October 25, 2023.

Resolution No. CB-23-034, Dated December 20, 2023. Authorizes the Memorandum of Understanding with the Independent State Store Union, Liquor Store Managers Unit executed on November 8, 2023.

## MUNICIPAL POLICE OFFICERS' EDUCATION AND TRAINING COMMISSION

### Approved Reading Comprehension Tests

The Municipal Police Officers' Education and Training Commission (Commission) publishes the following notice in accordance with the requirements of 53 Pa.C.S. § 2164(8)(iii)(A) (relating to powers and duties of commission), as amended by Act 37 of 2023. Section 2164(8)(iii)(A) requires the Commission to approve at least two reading comprehension tests that can be used to demonstrate reading comprehension as a prerequisite to employment as a police officer. At a special meeting held on December 21, 2023, the Commission voted on and approved the following reading comprehension tests, which may be used immediately:

1. The Nelson-Denny reading test requiring a score of at least a ninth-grade reading level.

2. The National Police Officer Selection Test consisting of the Reading Comprehension section requiring a score of at least 70%.

## PENNSYLVANIA PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION

### Distributed Energy Resources Participation in Wholesale Markets; Doc. No. L-2023-3044115

On November 9, 2023, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Commission) entered a Joint Motion at the previously captioned docket directing its Law Bureau and Bureau of Technical Utility Services to, by February 28, 2024, prepare for the Commission's consideration of an Advanced Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (ANOPR) regarding any amendments or additions needed to align existing Commission regulations or policy statements with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's Order No. 2222.

In an effort to obtain initial input from distributed energy resource aggregators, which may be impacted by the ANOPR, the Commission will be hosting a virtual meeting by means of Microsoft Teams on February 1, 2024, from 2 p.m. to 3 p.m. At this meeting, stakeholders will have the opportunity to share their ideas with Commission staff on issues and topics to be addressed in the ANOPR proceeding.

## STATE ETHICS COMMISSION

### Medical Marijuana List

Under the Medical Marijuana Act (act) (35 P.S. §§ 10231.101—10231.2110), the Pennsylvania State Ethics Commission (Commission) shall biennially publish a list of all State, county, municipal and other government positions that meet the definition of "public official" or "executive-level public employee" as defined under 4 Pa.C.S. § 1512(b) (relating to financial and employment interests) of the Gaming Act, 4 Pa.C.S. § 1512(b) or the definition of "public official" as set forth in the act. See 35 P.S. § 10231.2101.1.
